

Pillar 1:



Support Continuance of Government Functions

1-1: Emergency Economic Recovery Development Policy Loan

■ Budget Support 78 billion JPY (approximately US\$600 million) loan disbursed May-June 2022 as co-financing with World Bank







Pillar 2:

Assist Displaced Ukrainians and Host Countries



2-1: Economic Recovery DPL to Moldova

■ **Budget Support** 13.5 billion JPY (approximately US\$ 100 million) committed

2-2: Increase resilience of Moldova's health and medical emergency system

- Deliver up to 1 billion JPY (approximately US\$ 7.5 million) in medical equipment to Moldova
- Providing technical assistance for maintenance of medical equipment

Assist Displaced Ukrainians and Host Countries



2-3: Support Ukraine through partnership with Poland

- ☐ Joint demining training (Poland Japan Cambodia)
- □ Provided IT sector technical training for displaced Ukrainians in Poland, in cooperation with The Polish-Japanese Academy of Information Technology (PJAIT) in Warsaw


JICA's commitment for Recovery of Ukraine

□ Providing technical assistance (approximately 1.2 billion JPY) and grant aid up to 75,512 million (US\$ 570 million) for Emergency Recovery

Grant Aid (Phase 1): 22,440 million JPY (March 9)

Grant Aid (Phase 2): 53,072 million JPY (April 14)

□ Conduct Remote Damage Assessments utilizing satellite imagery and Data Collection Survey on Logistics

3-2: Winterization assistance

■ 300 Generators delivered to Ministry of Energy and other institutions in Ukraine

3-3: Humanitarian demining

- Provide mine detectors (ALIS) and trucks with cranes
- □ Practical training on use of ALIS mine detectors with CMAC in Cambodia and machinery training in Japan, anuary 2023

3-4: Post-disaster waste management: removal of debris and rubble

- ☐ Online seminars connecting local governments in Japan and Ukraine to share Japan's knowledge and experience of debris removal
- Heavy duty debris clearance machines delivered and use management provided







- Necessary equipment, including portable transmitters, provided to the Public Broadcasting Company of Ukraine (PBC)
- ☐ Training provided jointly with NHK

3-6: Recovery of agricultural production capacity

- Sunflower and corn seeds purchased and distributed to approximately 400 smallholder farmers in Kharkiv, in partnership with FAO
- □ Delivered Seeds of Winter Rye for Test Cultivation (10 ton) and Seeds of Winter rapeseed for Test Cultivation (150kg)
- ☐ Invitation Programs to Japan for knowledge and technology sharing of Japan in April and July





Support Ukrainian-led Recovery and Reconstruction

3-7: Invitation program to Japan

- ☐ Invited officials of Ministry of Communities, Territories and Infra Dev, and several local governments such as Kyiv Oblast, Cities of Odessa, Kharkiv, Kherson, Mykolaiv, Dnipro.
- ☐ Visits were made to major cities of Japan: Yokohama, Osaka, Kyoto, Kobe and Hiroshima.
- Lectures were delivered regarding Japan's experience on its recovery from the World War II and natural disasters like earthquakes.










3-8: Empowering Startups

- □ Launched Project NINJA (Next Innovation with Japan) in Ukraine in January 2022
- □ Conducted Acceleration programs for six IT startups, chosen through a rigorous selection process from among 54 applicants
- Held a pitch event in May 2023 that portrayed the resilience of the Ukrainian entrepreneurs who have been continuing their businesses with a vision for the future of their country, despite the challenging circumstances
