## Annual Report of the Examiners' Panel (FY2008)

#### 1. Introduction

(1) Outline of the Objection System

In April 1, 2005 JICA established the Modus Operandi of the Objection System regarding compliance with Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as 'JICA') Guidelines for Environmental and Social Considerations in order to ensure compliance with JICA Guidelines for Environmental and Social Considerations (hereinafter referred to as 'the Guidelines').

The purpose of the Objection System is as follows.

- 1) To provide opportunities for people actually and potentially damaged by JICA-assisted cooperation projects to submit objections in order to ensure compliance with the Guidelines.
- 2) To investigate the objections and reflect the findings on to cooperation projects.
- 3) To encourage dialogues between the project proponent and the requesters who submitted objections regarding environmental and social considerations through above 1) and 2).

Projects that are subject to the Objection System are any cooperation projects, which are or were adopted on and after April 1, 2005 and in which substantial damage has actually been incurred or is likely to be incurred in the future due to JICA's non-compliance with the Guidelines.

In October 1, 2008 the following two Examiners were reappointed as the Examiners' Panel. (JICA's New Guidelines for environmental and Social Consideration is under examination)
