## SUSTAINED COOPERATION BY THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT TO ZAMBIA'S HEALTH SECTOR AT KANYAMA HOSPITAL REPRESENTED BY THE JAPANESE FLAG AND ZAMBIA'S FLAG ON THE WATER TOWER

n 4th September, 2023, JICA Zambia with the Cassiopeia Project team led a high-level parliamentary delegation of the house of councilors of Japan, Mr. Maitachi Shoji and Mr. Aoyama Shigeharu to Kanyama first level hospital. The reason for the visit to the hospital was to review Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA) to Zambia's health sector, which includes the grand aid project for upgrading of health centers to District hospitals in Lusaka (Phase 1 and 2) and the other health technical cooperation project.

Upon arrival the delegation was welcomed by Kanyama first level hospital management led by the Medical Superintendent (MS) Dr. Wilson Mbewe, JICA Zambia and Cassiopeia project team.

The delegation was led through the trauma and emergency unit in the old building of the hospital which was used as the Out-patient department (OPD) before the construction of the new hospital building by the Japanese Government. It was set close to the main entrance considering the patient flow. However, the unit has since been renovated by Kanyama first level hospital themselves.

The delegation also visited Maternal Child Health Department (MCH) and were shown the statistics of the deliveries including the Cesarean sections for each month and how the numbers of the Cesarean section have reduced despite the limited resources and insufficient capacity to meet the demanding population. They then moved to the post-natal ward theater, the female surgical ward and the Kangaroo care where the Japanese Government donated infant warmers as well as photo

therapy equipment. Another department that was visited was the pharmacy department where the 5S Kaizen-TOM activity has been implemented to improve the organization of the pharmacy and stock management.

Speaking during the parliamentary delegation of the house of councilors visit Dr, Wilson Mbewe gave a brief overview of Kanyama's services, catchment population of five hundred and firth-five thousand 555, 000 and the vision to provide evidencebased patient centered care in an optimal healing environment through total quality management. He further went on to say that the Japanese Government and JICA support really goes beyond and greatly impacts people's lives. In terms of infrastructure, the new building built by the Japanese government has increased and improved the services offered.

There has also been continued support in terms of equipment and also technical knowledge in hospital management and how to manage patients through the Cassiopeia project. He hopes that with this continued collaboration and partnership, the quality of services will be improved. During the visit, the District Health Director (DHD) Dr. Astridah Maseka said that the country is implementing the decentralization policy meaning that services will reach the lowest levels in communities and encompass those that are not able to access healthcare.

The delegation were happy to see the good coordination and management system at kanyama level 1 hospital. The water tower elevated structure with the Zambian and Japanese flags amazed the delegation as it represents the cooperation that exists between Japan and Zambia.

# INFECTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL (IPC) INTERVENTIONS TO HELP BREAK THE CHAIN OF INFECTIONS IN HOSPITALS

rimary health care facilities and hospitals are the first point of care for people seeking healthcare. Patients are thus highly prone to infections and rely on a safe and clean environment. Lack of appropriate infection prevention and control measures which includes lack of water, sanitation and hygiene services in the health facility increases the patient's exposure of infection. Infection prevention and control is a critical component of patient safety and quality health services, yet it has been neglected in recent past. The IPC programme in hospitals aims to improve and ensure clean and safe service delivery and prevent hospital acquired infections in the hospital.

Chilenje level 1 hospital with

support from JICA Cassiopeia Project is now using an infection prevention checklist to ensure that that the wards are following the infection prevention guidelines and keeping the hospital surrounding clean. On September 14, 2023 JICA Cassiopeia project team and Chilenje level 1 infection and prevention team went around the hospital to inspect and ensure the wards are kept clean at all times and note the washing basins which are functionable and those which are not so that those that are not functionable can be replaced or fixed. The plan is to make these inspection visits as a routine exercise.

These exercises will assist to ensure that there is access to clean, safe and adequate water, hand washing, appropriate sanitation, solid waste management, cleaning and sterilization to enhance infection prevention and the control the transmission of diseases in the facility.

The activity has been very beneficial because the hospital staff now know how to identify problems and resolve some of them while maintaining a clean and healthy environment. This awareness has improved the quality of health in the hospital. Therefore, good infection prevention and control practices require a coordinated and continuous approach to ensure reduction of health care acquired infections in the hospital, to the patients and to the community at large.
