ICA Cassiopeia Project team headed by Dr. Norizuki Masataro visited Liteta District Hospital and Malombe Rural Health Center in Central Province, Zambia on 2nd October. together with the Rocinantes team. The reason for the visit was to interact with the hospital management by sharing good practices of the project and what the hospital can get from the projects' goal and key result areas, as well as to understand the different departments' operations and processes that take place in the facilities such as the number of patients seen per day and the referral system of patients to other higher hospitals. Challenges that the health facilities face were also discussed such as lack of space for the mothers' shelter as well as challenges with triaging patients that come to the facilities and the emergency unit.

During the visits, the team visited different departments of the health facility, operating theatre, Pharmacy, OPD, Maternity, High dependency unit, Male and Female ward, and the laboratory. While going round the departments the Cassiopeia Project team was given information regarding the respective departments visited and the project team offered its best practices on how best they can improve the services offered to the patients. For instance, on stock management of medicines, the hospital was encouraged to have committee meetings to help plan and carry out action points as well as ways to improve on infection prevention and control such as waste management at the facilities.

Health facilities face challenges regarding management of pharmaceuticals, medical consumables medical equipment such as lack of equipment, preventive maintenance issues, human resource at the facility and also issues to deal with emergency/trauma center and lack of space is a challenge for the health facilities.

That is why to reduce these challenges JICA through the project Strengthening Management Capacity for the General Hospitals in Lusaka District is supporting and working to strengthening the ability to improve problems based on monitoring, strengthening infection control, stock management of medicines and consumables and the maintenance of facility equipment and strengthening cooperation between the five targeted level one hospitals in Lusaka district namely; Chilenje, Chipata, Chawama, Kanyama, and Matero, the Lusaka Provincial Health Office (LPHO), Lusaka District Health Office (LDHO), and Ministry of Health (MOH).

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building apacity programmes are essential they provide opportunity to align the programmes priorities support operational objectives in the hospitals' implementation and interventions. Chipata Hospital Capacity building programme was conducted over a 5-day period in Chongwe and the main objective was to acquire knowledge in order to implement the Japan Management models in the hospital operations.

The training included presentations and discussions on pharmacy procurement processes, introduction to Kaizen, the 5S concept for sorting, setting, shining, standardizing and sustaining as a way of organizing and managing the workspace and work flow with the intent to improve efficiency and organization

for a productive work environment. Other topics also included continuous quality improvement, lessons from the philosophy and principles of Shinseikai Toyama hospital in Japan on "JIRI RITA" showing kindness to the patients, patient centered care and principles and characteristics of management (Quality Management) just to list a few.

During the training the project expert in Hospital Management/ Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Ms. Nyanga Michiko gave a brief activity update on the current situation of the on-going Infection Prevention and Control activities at Chipata level one hospital such as zoning of waste management bins and labelling and placing of visual signs for waste management. She also commended the hospital of starting an infection prevention and control committee and

urged the departments to fully take part in the on-going activities so that no one is left behind and the hospital progresses together.

And the project expert in Pharmaceutical product Inventory Management/ Medical Equipment Management Mr. Kohei Shiota then ran the trainees through the weekly reporting system for medical equipment at Chipata which has been very good. He urged the hospital management to continue submitting the medical equipment weekly reports as this is important for senior management to take note and act upon the equipment that is non-functional. He also advised the pharmacy department to continue to update the drug tracer list so that stock availability of drugs is assured
