FLUE GAS DESULPHURIZATION CONSTRUCTION PROJECT FOR UGLJEVIK THERMAL POWER PLANT

Scheme: **ODA loan** L/A: **October 2009**

Counterpart organization: Ugljevik Thermal Power Plant

The thermal power plant in Ugljevik, built in 1985, was not adjusted to the strict EU environmental standards regarding the emission of SO_2 . The Project is expected to reduce the amount of sulphur in flue gases that cause substantial air contamination. Installation of flue gas desulphurization will help to meet EU requirements in decreasing SO_2 in thermal power plants to the acceptable level of 200 mg of sulphur – dioxide concentration in flue gases per cubic meter by 2023.



THE PROJECT FOR CONFIDENCE BUILDING THROUGH PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The education system in BiH recognizes three official (ethnically driven) school curricula. In 2007, the BiH authorities created the state-level Agency for Preschool, Primary and Secondary Education (APOSO), mandated with creating joint framework curricula for all school

subjects, known as the Common Core Curricula (CCC), which defines what the three official curricula must have in common. In the past, with the

the BiH education authorities harmonized and modernized the information technology curricula for the general education secondary schools; elements of which were subsequently incorporated into the CCC for technical education (TE) and information technology (IT).

Following the success of the TE/IT CCC creation, JICA extended its cooperation with APOSO to help create CCC for the Physical and Health Education domain. On the other hand, the City of Mostar has recognized a potential opportunity in using sports as a means of promoting tolerance and strengthening relationships within the ethnically diverse local community. JICA assisted the City of Mostar Sports Association (SSGM) with strengthening their institutional capacities and had jointly with them organized several initiatives, promoting social inclusion, diversity and fairness.

The Project aims to establish a "Mentor Service System", in which the mentors provide practical advice to SMEs to grow their businesses. This system is based on the Japanese experience of government-certified business advisers for SMEs. JICA started the first phase of the Project in Serbia in 2008; it expanded to BiH, Macedonia and Montenegro in phase 2 of the Project. BiH is striving to expand the mentoring service to the whole country and to establish a trainer system.

ODA LOAN

The ODA loans support developing countries by providing low-interest, long-term and concessional funds. The ODA loans are used for large-scale infrastructure and other forms of development that require substantial funds.



JICA supports the acceleration of developing countries' economic/social growth through the private sector, through debt and equity investment for the development projects of private companies.

Grants are the provisions of funds to developing countries that have low income levels, without the obligation of repayment. Grants are used for the improvement of basic infrastructures such as schools, hospitals, water-supply facilities and roads, along with obtaining health and medical care, equipment and other requirements.
