Air pollution is becoming a serious issue in Kosovo, and there is a growing concern over the health among the people. In order to tackle the issue, JICA, together with the Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning, has been implementing the project to improve the capacities of the Ministry and related agencies to better measure and control air pollution. As a part of the project, JICA donated to the Hydro-Meteorological Institute of Kosovo 100 technical equipment for the exhaust gas measurement and air quality measurement.

improve the public waste disposal systems in Prizren and some municipalities surrounding Prizren by providing the relevant utility companies with about 40 new compacter trucks.

It has been 20 years since the end of the conflict in Kosovo, but there is still a need for the improvement of the inter-ethnic relationships. In order to foster the collaboration, JICA has supported Kosovo's public broadcaster, Radio Television of Kosovo (RTK), in the production and broadcasting of information programs jointly produced by a multi-ethnic team. The team produced an informational program called "UMAMI," which name is derived from the Japanese word for savory taste, which is being broadcast. Based on the concept of interethnic collaboration, UMAMI is a probing documentary that covers a variety of topics from both perspectives. The show has been broadcasted with subtitles in both Albanian and Serbian languages.

TRAINING ON ENHANCING TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE AND CAPACITY FOR FOOD SAFETY CONTROL

Technical Cooperation (Third Country training) Scheme: Project period: September 2017- October 2020 Counterpart organization: **Kosovo Food and Veterinary Agency (KFVA)**

Strengthening the capacity of the agriculture sector is set as a priority in Kosovo. In this regard, improving the productivity and quality of products in the agriculture sector are highlighted as well as increasing competitiveness and alignment to EU standards. In particular, food safety concern is one of the general objectives of Kosovo.

Based on the discussion between the JICA ODA Adviser and the senior management of the Kosovo Food and Veterinary Agency (KFVA) who participated in the JICA training program in 2012, the needs of KFVA for strengthening its capacity for auditing the food safety control process was identified. The project intends to create a group of trainers for food safety control measures especially focusing on auditing Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) implementation and General Principles of Food Hygiene.
