Many Filipinos and foreigners travel to Baguio to ①take a stroll in the beautiful Burnham Park and Wright Park, ②experience American-style cabins and lodging at Camp John Hay, ③go strawberry-picking in the La Trinidad Farm, and ④take photos in the pine tree-filled Mines View Park.

However, as the demographic increase of residents and tourists, so does the wastewater production in the city.

Between 1980 and 1990, JICA assisted the city in building its own 8,600 cubic meter capacity sewerage treatment plant and 57 km pipelines to service around 10,000 households and establishments.

However, considering the city's current population of more than 360,000<sup>1</sup> and an 1.5 million<sup>2</sup> tourist population recorded in 2019, the current facility is no longer able to cope up with the demand for wastewater treatment.

Due to limited wastewater treatment facilities, only a small percentage of household wastewater gets treated, posing a serious problem of sewage overflows into rivers, groundwater, and drainage systems in this beautiful city. Such a situation is becoming a serious risk of water contamination of Baguio's water supply resources.

Also considering the health risk, JICA has teamed up with the City of Baguio and FujiClean, to improve the city's wastewater management initiatives.
