This is also an exceptional privilege and honor for us.

During this occasion, JICA stressed that we will continue to support Bangsamoro's transition to a real autonomous and functional government so that people in the region can undoubtedly feel the dividend of peace through the painstaking efforts of the government in securing socioeconomic stability and prosperity.

We continue to honor those commitments.

Kasama niyo kami.

As a long-standing and close friend of the Bangsamoro people, JICA is walking with you.

This is because JICA believes that the sustainable stability and prosperity of the Bangsamoro is not only crucial to this limited region, but also to the entire Philippines, the entire Asia and the world.

At this point, let's look at our nations' common experiences, learn from each other, and solve challenges together.

Personally, today I have learned several important secrets of our successful path, such as;

- a) Seeking solutions through cooperation and collaboration, not through force and threat,
- b) Building and strengthening mutual trust
- c) Illustrating clear vision for the brighter future and actual feeling with lowhanging-fruits and peace dividends

Like my personal learning case, I wish that all of you enjoyed a productive and dynamic exchange of ideas, and shared value of peace, from today's lecture and discussion.

This has been a momentous event, especially since we are celebrating the National Peace Consciousness Month in the Philippines, which aims to make everyone an active peacemaker

I believe your, no, our joint efforts and dedication to the stable and prosperous Bangsamoro deserve the Nobel Peace Prize. Let's keep it up! We can do it. Nothing is impossible. We can turn the word "impossible" into "I'm possible".

At my closing, I sincerely hope that today's JICA Chair special session contributes to the stability and prosperity of the Bangsamoro and the entire Philippines, and also presents an exemplary future to the whole world.
