
What is JICA?

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) assists and supports developing countries as the executing agency of Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA). In accordance with its vision of "leading the world with trust," JICA supports the resolution of issues of developing countries by using the most suitable tools of various assistance methods and a combined regional-, country- and issue-oriented approach.

JICA, the world's largest bilateral aid agency, works in over 150 countries and regions and has some 90 overseas offices.



In cases of the occurrence of a large-scale disaster, JICA dispatches Disaster Relief Teams and/or provides emergency supplies.

Technical Cooperation

Technical Cooperation is an all-embracing term used to describe JICA's practical assistance to developing countries. Depending on the specific project, technical assistance can include the dispatch of JICA experts, the training of local officials for 'capacity development', the supply of equipment or financial assistance.

ODA Loans

ODA Loans support developing countries by providing lowinterest, long-term concessional loans to finance their development efforts. ODA loans, which require repayment, underpin developing countries' ownership in the process.

Grant Aid

This is a type of **ODA Grant** in which the government of a partner country enters contracts with consultants or contractors to build facilities or to procure equipment and materials. It is mainly used for establishing foundations for basic human needs or for building socio-economic infrastructures.

Cooperation Through Citizen Participation

JICA's Volunteer Program supports activities by citizens who wish to cooperate in the economic and social development and the reconstruction of developing countries. Through these cooperation activities, participating volunteers can not only contribute to the development of partner countries but also gain valuable experience in terms of international goodwill, mutual understanding and an expansion of their international perspectives.

JICA Partnership Program (JPP) is a technical cooperation program implemented by JICA to contribute to the social and economic development of developing countries at the grassroots level in collaboration with "Partners in Japan," such as NGOs, universities, local governments, and public corporations.

History of JICA's Cooperation in Solomon Islands

JICA's assistance to the Solomon Islands started in 1978. The first cooperation were two Grant Aid projects and the dispatching of 2 volunteers in Auki, Malaita. Since then, the Government of Japan has extended its assistance in the sum of over 51 billion Japanese Yen. (as of March 2021)

JICA invites personnel from developing countries to Japan for training to transfer Japan's technology, skills and knowledge. Since 1978, 1,031 Solomon Islands Government officials and officers from State-Owned Enterprises had been trained including the online programs during the recent COVID-19 pandemic.

As of March 2022, JICA Solomon Islands office has dispatched a total of 19 Solomon Islands Government officers to study Masters courses in Japan since 2016.

An association of Ex-JICA Training Participants named Solomon-Nihon (JICA) Alumni Association was established in June 1995.

JICA Volunteer Program


Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCV)
