Background:

The Bangsamoro Professionals Mapping (BPM) is a 'human resource inventory' for the Bangsamoro professionals in the Philippines and those who are living abroad. The BMP aims to identify available potential human resources of the Bangsamoro through registration in the BPM database.

Objectives:

- To identify professionals and other potential human resources who are willing to voluntarily support the Bangsamoro Government
- 2) To sort out various levels of human resources, namely: top-management, middle-level, and front-line personnel among the identified human resources
- 3) To equip professionals with knowledge needed.

All Bangsamoro, including Indigenous People, and other political entity settling and born in the defined territory of the Bangsamoro can register. The Bangsamoro Professionals Mapping is only intended to gather and analyse data of the Bangsamoro Professionals with the help of the database. The activities involved do not promote recruitment or job hiring for any position.

ACTIVITIES:

- Formal Launching The BPM project was formally launched in June 2014 at Cotabato City by BTC Chair Mohagher Iqbal and JICA Officials. Representatives from various sectors like government, academe and NGOs were present in the said event.
- Information Drive Aside from promotion through social media, posters, flyers and radio advertisements, three (3) NGOs (UNYPAD, MAPAD and BLMI) conducted information dissemination campaign in selected areas in mainland and island provinces in Mindanao.
- 3) Website Registration / Submission of Personal Data Sheets (PDS) – Bangsamoro Professionals who are interested to be included in the database can register online at http://bangsamoroprofessionals.org or submit their PDS at the BPM Implementation Unit. Deadline is until November 15, 2014.
- 4) Data Analysis The data will be analyzed by an IT Expert and a statistician wherein several categories such as fields of expertise, educational background and work experience, among others will be identified.
- 5) Presentation of BPM Report The outcome of the BPM project will be reported to the Bangsamoro Transition Commission and other relevant agencies. The report will serve as a reference in drafting the Human Resource Development Plan of the new Bangsamoro Government.
