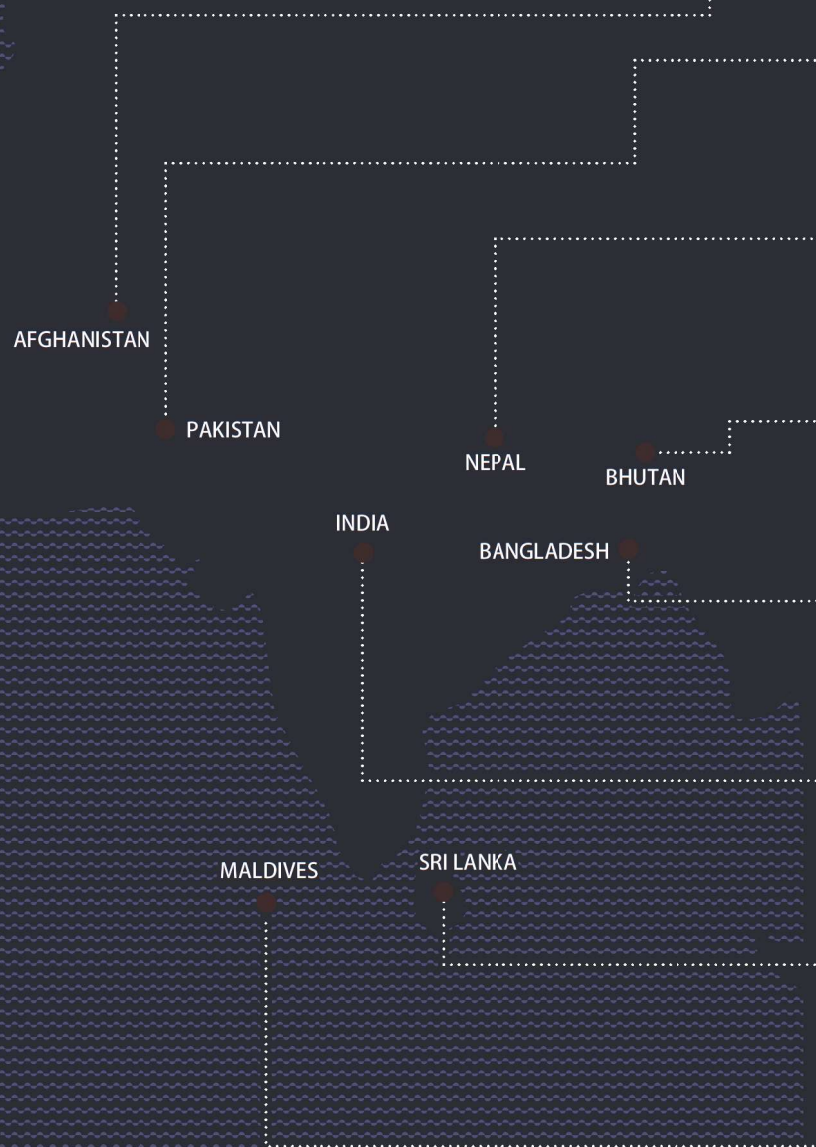


JICA in South Asia

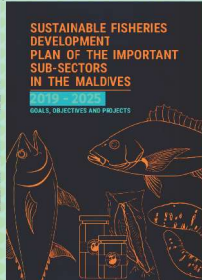

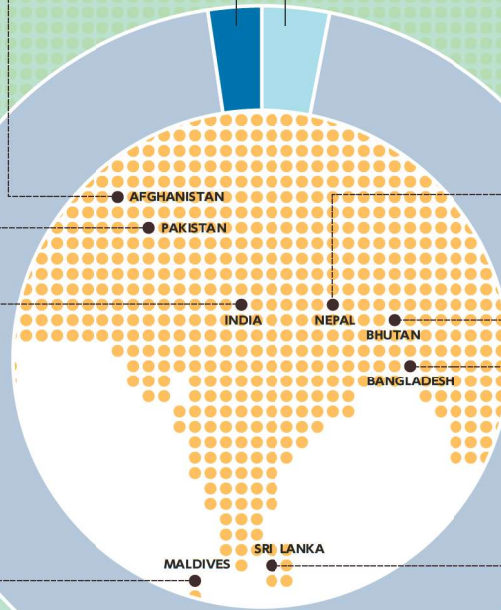

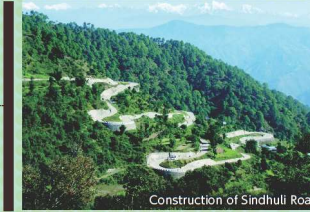

At times, equipment is carried by people

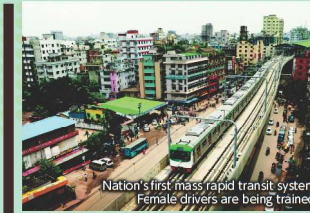
A palm-size device saves lives. Enables remote prenatal checkups from mountainous areas.



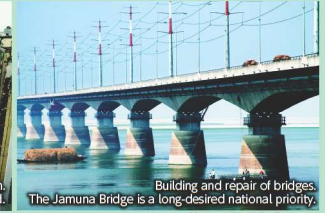
