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Preface

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) has launched 'JICA Partnership Program (JPP)' since 2002 and the JPP started in Nepal since 2003. This purpose is to support Japanese groups (NGOs, local governments, and Japanese Universities etc.) to utilize their accumulated knowledge and experience in assistance activities for developing countries through Official Development Assistance (ODA).

During 2003 to 2024, total 40 projects had completed in Nepal and 11 projects have been on-going as of July 2024. Fields of project are varied such as agriculture, health, education, improvement of income etc and aim to contribute Nepalese people and society at grass-root level.

NGO-JICA Japan Desk Coordinator (NGO Desk) is located within JICA Nepal Office. It has been providing information about current situation and legal matter of NGO activity in Nepal. Moreover, NGO Desk has been coordinating between Japanese NGOs and Nepalese NGOs to work together effectively under JPP. NGO Desk is ready to support international cooperation at grass-root level so everyone can contact freely.



JICA Partnership Program (JPP)

The Japanese government offers various assistance programs to meet the diverse needs of developing countries through ODA. In international cooperation, the role of NGOs and local governments has become more important, both in Japan and in developing countries.

The JICA Partnership Program (JPP) was introduced in 2002 to support and cooperate with the implementation of projects formulated by Japanese NGOs, Japanese local governments, and Japanese universities to utilize their accumulated knowledge and experience in assistance activities for developing countries.

JPP is a technical cooperation program implemented by JICA to contribute to the social and economic development of developing countries at the grass-roots level in collaboration with "Partners in Japan," such as NGOs, universities, local governments, and public corporations.

The main objectives of JPP

- 1. Meeting the diverse needs of developing countries by utilizing the knowledge and experience of Partners in Japan for international cooperation activities
- Strengthening collaboration between communities in both developing countries and Japan by promoting the participation of Japanese citizens in international cooperation activities
- Encouraging local citizens in Japan to employ their knowledge, experience, and technologies for international cooperation activities, which in turn revitalize Japanese communities

The target countries are those that have approved the acceptance of JPP and where JICA overseas offices or JICA. JPP is implemented by JICA in collaboration with Partners in Japan based on proposals submitted by the Partners. The recipient government's approval is necessary prior to implementation of the program or individual projects, in accordance with the procedures agreed upon between the two governments. Because JPP is not based on official requests from the recipient government, there is no requirement for an international agreement between the governments of the recipient country and Japan.

The recipient government is not required to grant any special privileges, such as tax exemptions, to Partners in Japan. However, the recipient government is expected to accord the same privileges, exemptions, and benefits as those accorded to any third-country organization or international organization performing similar missions in the recipient country.

JPP can be applied by Japanese organization only. Japanese organization should have established good relationship with Nepali NGO before applying JPP.

JPP has three types depend on nature of Japanese group, its experience and size of project.



"If I can make a living through farming, I want to live in the village with my family." quietly voiced a young man on the brink of departing abroad for work. It was with the aspiration to materialize these sentiments that this project took root.

Despite over 60% of Nepal's population being engaged in agriculture, the sector contributes only about 30% to the country's GDP. This indicates that agriculture has not fully developed as a national industry, resulting in a serious migration from hillside villages. In the project area, while more than 90% of residents rely mainly on agriculture for their livelihoods, only 60% of households can sustain themselves through subsistence farming throughout the year. Furthermore, in over half of these households, at least one family member seeks employment as a migrant worker either domestically or internationally.

Given the unsuitability of large-scale mechanized farming in the target hillside region, the project focuses on generating cash income by integrating the cultivation and commercialization of vegetables, fruits, and cash crops like coffee, leveraging the local terrain and climatic conditions. Specifically, the project aims to improve the livelihoods of small-scale farmers through the production and marketing of vegetables and coffee. This involves: 1) training young leaders in the agriculture sector and building cooperation among stakeholders, 2) improving cultivation techniques and establishing stable production systems, and 3) developing a profitable sales network while considering market linkages. The project will work with 900 farming households in these endeavors.

The goal of this project is to enable as many farmers as possible to proudly declare, "I am a professional farmer, and agriculture is my vocation," rather than saying, "I'm only doing agriculture because I can't do anything else."

We have been working for improving maternal and child health since 2008. Initially focusing on providing ambulances, medical equipment, and supporting construction of hospital. From 2015, we launched a JICA Partnership Program (JPP) , enhancing health education and capacity building for healthcare providers.

Phase 3 of JPP started in 2023, we are focusing on two main activities.

- 1) utilize of the maternal and child health handbook (MCHHB) to implement continuum of care from pregnancy to infancy. This allows healthcare providers and mothers to share information and provide high-quality health guidance. The MCHHB is recognized positively by healthcare providers as an essential tool for mothers to manage their and their children's health, and has gained support from Pokhara City, Kaki District and Gandaki Province.
- 2) to support breastfeeding through breast care. In particular, the Kawate Breast Massage (KBM), devised by the midwife Kawate from Komagane City, is an effective massage technique that improves milk flow, and has been well-received by mothers treated by trained healthcare providers.

Additionally, we annually host trainings from Pokhara City to Komagane City, facilitating exchanges at the citizen level and gifting handcrafted items to mothers in Pokhara. These efforts have increased happiness and created a cycle of goodwill beyond mere support.

Support for Video Education Specializing in Science and Mathematics and Implementation of Workshops for Teachers

In addition to the creation of new video materials, the project is implementing activities aimed at improving education at schools by creating manuals for using the video materials and holding workshops for teachers to actually use the materials in the classroom. In some of the pilot schools using the video materials, remarkable results have been achieved, such as an increase in the number of students passing the Secondary Education Examination (SEE) from 15% to 50%, and the demonstration project is currently being implemented in 10 pilot schools. In addition, in order to strengthen ICT support to each school by the local government, we are working on the creation of a local government-level training program to train "ICT Facilitators," which is based on the ICT support staff that supports the GIGA School Program in Japan.

With the goal of protecting lives and infrastructure from frequent river flooding, improving the living environment, and reducing poverty, the project aims to promote the use of strong, low-cost gabion revetments that utilize traditional Japanese knowledge and promote river disaster mitigation measures with the participation of local residents in Gorkha District.

Kochi University, as an implementing organization of the Grassroots Technical Cooperation Project, has been transferring the traditional Japanese "gabion" technology to the Nepalese government and other organizations through counterparts in Nepal since FY2016. This project is a step-up to the more technically challenging river disaster countermeasures.

Nepal experiences river overflows almost every year due to torrential rains during the rainy season, and many people are killed because they are unable to escape the floods. The project site, Gorkha District, is surrounded by mountainous terrain with heavy rainfall, but the residents' awareness of disaster prevention is low and the riverbanks are not well maintained, resulting in water-related disasters that threaten lives and livelihoods every year. In collaboration with local governments and residents, we will transfer technology for low-cost gabion revetments through demonstration construction. In addition, we will support river disaster prevention activities from the viewpoint of "soft" disaster prevention as well as "hard" disaster prevention, for example, by preparing flood hazard maps and conducting early evacuation drills.

At the same year with similar objectives, the Nepalese volunteers founded Love Green Nepal in Nepal. Since then, we have expanded the scope of our activities and implemented projects collaboratively in Nepal.

The major objective of the project is to further promotion of the IPM (Integrated Pest Management) technology in Panchkhal Municipality, Kavrepalanchok district near Kathmandu, and the marketing of IPM products.

The project encourages the farmers to adopt IPM technology which is an environment-friendly farming method that minimizes the use of pesticides, utilizes organic fertilizers and botanical pesticides, mixes crops, and grows safe products. It also helps to improve the process of producing, shipping, and selling of IPM vegetables. We aim to differentiate IPM products from other agricultural products and sell them in the local market of Panchkhal and Kathmandu.

We form 35 farmer groups in Panchkal and conduct IPMFFS, conduct market research and market study tours to farmers, and promote to produce the vegetables based on market needs. We provide imperative guidance on production plans and introduce the sales strategies of differentiating the IPM products.

Besides, a vegetable market will be set up in Panchkal in cooperation with the Panchkhal Municipality Office, with the motive of developing local markets to make it easier for farmers to sell their products. As the Araniko Highway (Kathmandu-Kodari)passes through Panchkal, the passengers of the highway are targeted as the main consumers whereas local consumers are developed as well. An increasing number of farmers are starting to take on marketing initiatives by themselves by selling IPM products along the highway.

Furthermore, we will also improve the shipping system for farmers and carry out awareness activities to promote a better understanding of IPM products among the producers and consumers.

The major earthquake that occurred in April 2015 caused a large number of deaths and injuries in Nepal. Many Nepalese people lack awareness of daily self-help and mutual-help, and have little experience in participating in disaster drills, which resulted in extensive damage. After the earthquake, the importance of and need for disaster prevention education in school education in Nepal increased.

Since 2015, Plus Arts has continuously supported the dissemination of disaster education in Nepal. Since 2017, within the framework of the JICA Grassroots Technical Cooperation Project, we have been working on training teachers of both public and private schools in five cities in the Kathmandu valley and creating a system of sustainable disaster education within schools.

In the first phase (2017-2018), we conducted teacher training and workshops to develop original disaster education programs, and conducted disaster prevention events for students in model schools.

Since club activity initiatives are well established in Nepalese elementary school, in the second phase (2018-2019), we established "DRR Education Club" and produced materials for club activity in order to create a sustainable disaster prevention education system at each In addition, in 2019, the Mitra DRR Learning Center was established in partnership with various stakeholders including with Plus Arts.

In August 2022, the third phase of the project began, with the goal of expanding and spreading "DRR Education Club" to neighboring schools of the model school, and forming a model of a local community that utilizes club activities.

"Strengthening Agricultural High School Education in Nepal Project"2016-2018, We collaborated with KAHS (Kami-ina Agricultural High School) in Nagano to conduct a baseline survey and identify issues using Kobang SS (Secondary School) in Mustang District (about 2600 m above sea level) as a model school to collect fundamental information.

The stakeholders learned about Japanese agricultural education methods at KAHS through training in Japan 2017.

In Phase 2, two agri-schools with different climates and agricultural vegetation will be selected as new target schools, modeled after the Kobang SS that preceded it, to establish educational systems and methods and create supplementary teaching materials while taking advantage of the environmental characteristics of each region. (Banepa SS: 1500m Kavre District; Ratnanagar SS: 1500m, Chitwan District)

In this phase, teachers from the three target schools visited each other, deepened their understanding of KAHS's practical agricultural education methods through training in Japan, and developed action plans. In order to realize the same kind of collaboration in Nepal as in Japan's FFJ (future farmers of Japan) in Jan. 2024, the first FFN (Future farmers of Nepal) Essay Contest was held.

The program also conducted online exchanges and study sessions in the classrooms of agricultural high schools in both Nepal and Japan and provided global-local education to teachers and students. KAHS students presented this exchange at the Nagano International Education Research Council and received the President's Award in 2022.

Finally, this project aims to strengthen agricultural education in rural areas of Nepal by developing and enhancing practical agricultural education systems, teaching methods, and teaching materials suited to Nepal's regions.

The Pilot Project of Accessible Communication Support for Hard of Hearing Patients at Kathmandu Hospital, is being implemented by SHRUTI and ZENNANCHO since January 2022 for three years under the JPP. Its aim is to establish communication support services for hearing loss patients at TUTH's ENT-HNS Department. Key project outputs include developing communication tools and guidelines for healthcare professionals and patients, fostering sustainable communication support between hearing loss patients and hospital staff, and promoting the adoption of the communication support model in other hospitals in Kathmandu. At the end of the project, the TUTH would have trained health professionals and its own communication resources to ensure sustainable accessible communication support for hearing loss patients, facilitating barrier-free access to healthcare services.

Initially, SHRUTI's instructors received a training from the ZENNANCHO. A three-day training session concluded at TUTH's ENT-HNS Department, drawing 46 participants from diverse roles including Residency Doctors, Nurses, Audiologists, Speech Language Therapists, Technicians, and Hospital Administration staff. The curriculum was developed through collaboration with TUTH and ZENNANCHO. The participants shared insights of the training and expressed appreciation for the invaluable experiences and knowledge gained. The participants anticipate that the training will significantly enhance future communication with hearing loss patients, underscoring its importance.

Activities and Outcomes of the Project:

Earmark development: The project has developed an Earmark which serves as a vital tool for identifying people with hearing loss, indicating areas with accessibility supports, and fostering inclusivity and independence to hearing loss people in public places. The earmark is widely used, visually appealing, and easily recognizable. The mark is implemented in various forms such as cards, badges, stickers, and nameplates, and used by people with hearing loss, supporters, and in places with improved accessibility.

Guidebook for Healthcare Services: A comprehensive guidebook has been developed to guide the health professionals such as doctors, nurses, health technicians and staff with valuable insights and strategies to enhance inclusive healthcare services for patients with hearing loss.

Communication Tools: Communication tools such as writing board, signages, figure-pointing pictograms, etc. have been developed to facilitate effective communication between healthcare professionals and patients with hearing loss, thereby enhancing the quality of care and patient experience.

Out of 40 farmers, 14 farmers have just plated 5 each kiwi saplings and iron trellis are being fixed. Rest of farmers will plant and install iron trellis next year. Farmers' livelihood improvement through potato and kiwi fruits cultivation and management is the main objective of the project. Making them capable for achieving local government subsidies is secondary objective of the project. Farmers are taught to keep records of agricultural financial transactions as well. Main activities of the project are as follow.

- 1. Conduct agricultural bookkeeping training for selected farmers and regular follow up.
- 2. Support farmers group to apply for local governments subsidies.
- 3. Conduct trainings on potato disease controlling.
- 4. Conduct trainings on kiwi cultivation and management techniques.
- 5. Kiwi sapling plantation, purchase materials of iron Trellis (Iron T shape) and install iron Trellis. (Selected farmers will contribute 30 percent of total cost of kiwi saplings, transportation and materials of Iron Trellis.)
- 6. Support the Farmers groups in conducting fruits market research of potato and kiwi.
- 7. Regular monitoring and supervision to execute the project activities.

The sustainable development goal of ensuring access to water and sanitation in Nepal, particularly in cities like Pokhara, faces challenges despite significant population coverage by city water. The Nepal Water Supply Corporation (NWSC) manages water supply. But faces issues with water quality control and high leakage rates, particularly during the rainy season. To address these challenges, NWSC is collaborating with Sapporo Water Bureau (SWB), Japan to enhance technical capacity through training program. These initiatives aim to improve water quality management and reduce leakage, ensuring a consistent supply of safe tap water for domestic use. LGN serves as the intermediary between SWB and NWSC, facilitating coordination and managing training activities in Nepal.

Background of Organization

SHRUTI, established in 2012 as an organization of personal disabilities by people affected by hearing loss, aiming to provide a unified platform and voice for the hard of hearing and deafened (HOH/d) community in Nepal. Registered with various governmental bodies and affiliated with international organizations like APFHD and IFHOH, SHRUTI actively advocates for the rights and empowerment of HOH/d people, addressing communication and cultural barriers they encounter. With a vision of fostering an inclusive society where the rights of HOH/d people are upheld, SHRUTI's mission revolves around ensuring their access to communication, quality education, and social and economic opportunities. The organization's objectives include promoting accessibility, enhancing member capacity, advocating for early intervention, and establishing rehabilitation and resource centre to support the HOH/d community.

The Pilot Project of Accessible Communication Support for Hard of Hearing Patients at Kathmandu Hospital, is being implemented by SHRUTI and ZENNANCHO since January 2022 for three years under the JPP. Its aim is to establish communication support services for hearing loss patients at TUTH's ENT-HNS Department. Key project outputs include developing communication tools and guidelines for healthcare professionals and patients, fostering sustainable communication support between hearing loss patients and hospital staff, and promoting the adoption of the communication support model in other hospitals in Kathmandu. At the end of the project, the TUTH would have trained health professionals and its own communication resources to ensure sustainable accessible communication support for hearing loss patients, facilitating barrier-free access to healthcare services.

Initially, SHRUTI's instructors received a training from the ZENNANCHO. A three-day training session concluded at TUTH's ENT-HNS Department, drawing 46 participants from diverse roles including Residency Doctors, Nurses, Audiologists, Speech Language Therapists, Technicians, and Hospital Administration staff. The curriculum was developed through collaboration with TUTH and ZENNANCHO. The participants shared insights of the training and expressed appreciation for the invaluable experiences and knowledge gained. The participants anticipate that the training will significantly enhance future communication with hearing loss patients, underscoring its importance.
