Discussion about infrastructure between JICA, DoA and UNESCO (May, 2016)

UNESCO held an initial coordinate meeting for the Integrated Management Plan of Bagan on 9-10 May 2016 at Archaeology Museum of Bagan. For the meeting, relevant organizations such as Ministry of Religious Affair and Culture (MoRAC), Association of Myanmar Architects (AMA) and local staff of JICA Expert Team (JET) attended and discussed the plan.

For the management plan, UNESCO advisor proposed six main categories: 1) Physical Planning, 2) Environmental Planning, 3) Archaeology and Conservation, 4) Agriculture and Livelihood, 5) Community and 6) others. Detailed issues are included in each category. As a part of the plan, JET will contribute mainly on 2) Physical Planning and 3) Environmental Planning related to the transportation and basic infrastructure.

JET and WG 2 members are developing the pilot project for public signage system, and creating samples of direction signs under advice from AMA and MoRAC. The idea of the sign is to produce them as a product of "Made in Bagan". That is the reason to use teak wood as a main material and to use hand curving culture as finalize the design.

We hope that all the people will love the signage design.

As one of activities in Pilot Project of Public Awareness in Human Resource Development, Second Cleaning Campaign has been planned and launched by WG 3. The leaders from 6 villages around the monument areas were selected and invited to participate in the Cleaning Campaign. On 15 February 2016, WG 3 members and village leaders held a meeting and discussed in details for preparation of Cleaning Campaign. On 20 February, Cleaning Campaign was held near Manuhar Temple at Myingabar village, near Ananda Temple at Taungbi village and near Gubyaukyi Temple at Wet Kyi Inn village at the same time. 50 villagers from each village were invited but more than 50 participants together with their leader came and joined. One of WG 3 members gave a speech for public awareness about cleaning at each village and then the public participated in the cleaning activity near the monuments and the roadsides. Director from MoHT, Naypyitaw and her team and Deputy Director from MoHT, Bagan Branch and his team supervised and participated in the activities of Cleaning Campaign. The Cleaning Campaign continued to next day at MinNanThu village, West PhwarSaw village and NatKyoAi village. It is expected that Cleaning Campaign will be conducted regularly by village people.

In March 2016, WG 1 members and Bagan staff went to two hotels in Nay Pyi Taw to monitor the craft displays with local craftsmen. As part of the strategy for promoting tourism, the craftsmen had a chance to evaluate their products. More than that, the display can contribute to the renovation materials for their lacquerware training school. The craftsmen were also asked to make souvenir gift samples for the Kempinski Hotel. It is a great honor to get that opportunity. Now all the craftsmen from the villages realize the importance of cooperating with communities the development of the tourism business environment. In the trial village cooking tour project, some of the participants' comments and the Newsletter article, draw the attention to the tour companies coordinators. We have received some enquiries for the next tour season to collaborate with local people to establish the cooking tour program. villagers want to take part in these activities for the long term, and have requested some technical assistance. WG 1 and WG 2 members will provide what is needed. In the coming few months, with the support of WG 1 and WG 2 members, it is expected that there will be real outcomes from Community Based Tourism (CBT) project activities.



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
