The TICAD process: A NEPAD perspective (1)

Shared values and principles of **ownership and partnership** from the outset

- TICAD IV: AUC as co-organizer of the TICAD process

Increased **coherence** between TICAD process and Africa's socio-economic transformation agenda

- TICAD III: Recognition of NEPAD as the development blueprint for Africa

Active supporter of **private sector engagement** in Africa's development

- TICAD II: Africa-Asia Business Forum (AABF)
- TICAD IV: Economic Growth” pillar
 - US \$ 4 billion allocated to building of hard infrastructure in Africa
 - US \$ 2.5 billion African Investment Facility of JBIC to catalyze Japanese private sector engagement

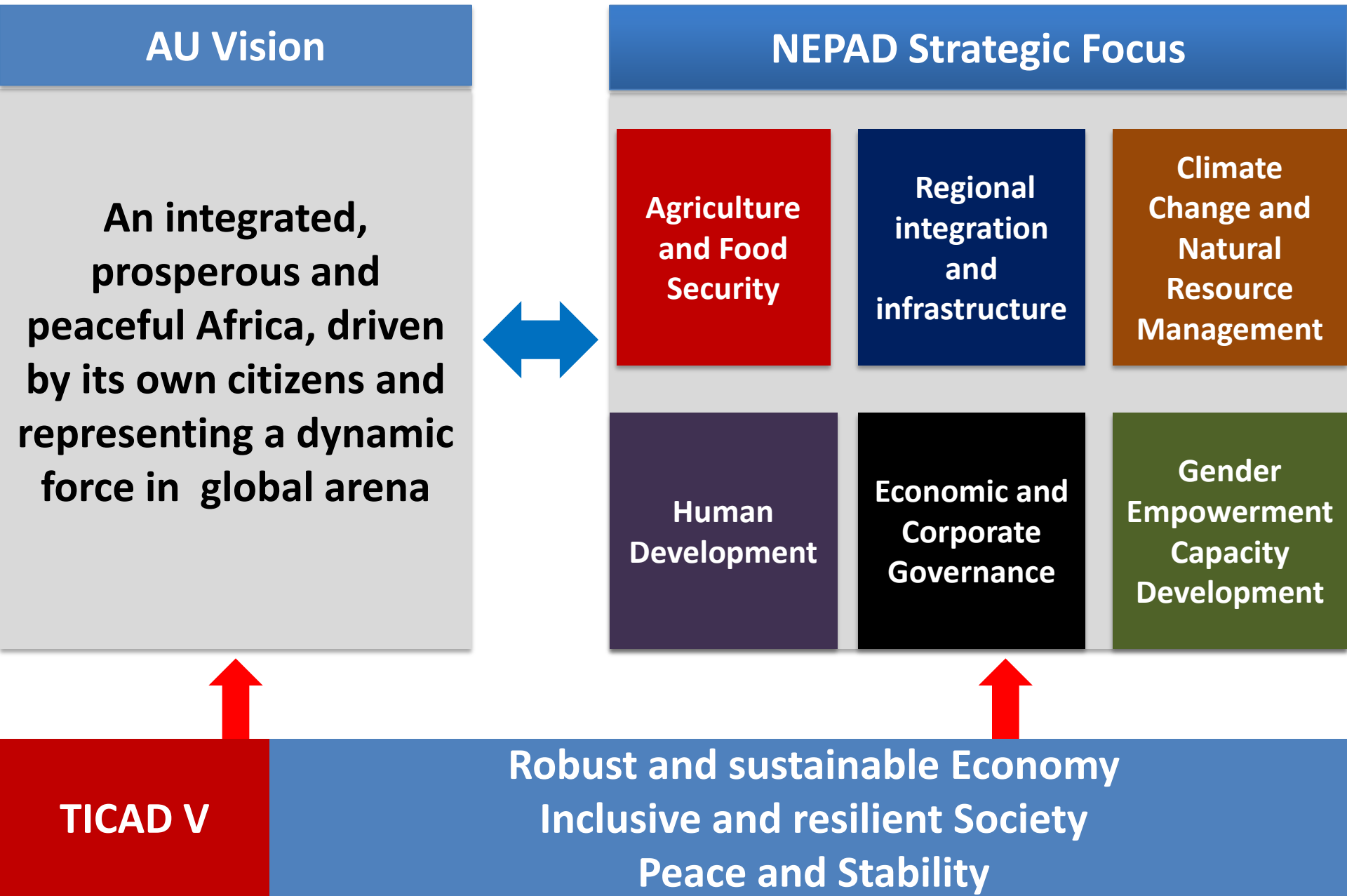
TICAD III set the stage for **NEPAD's role in TICAD process**, when the international community including Japan recognized **NEPAD as the development blueprint for Africa**.



Toward TICAD V

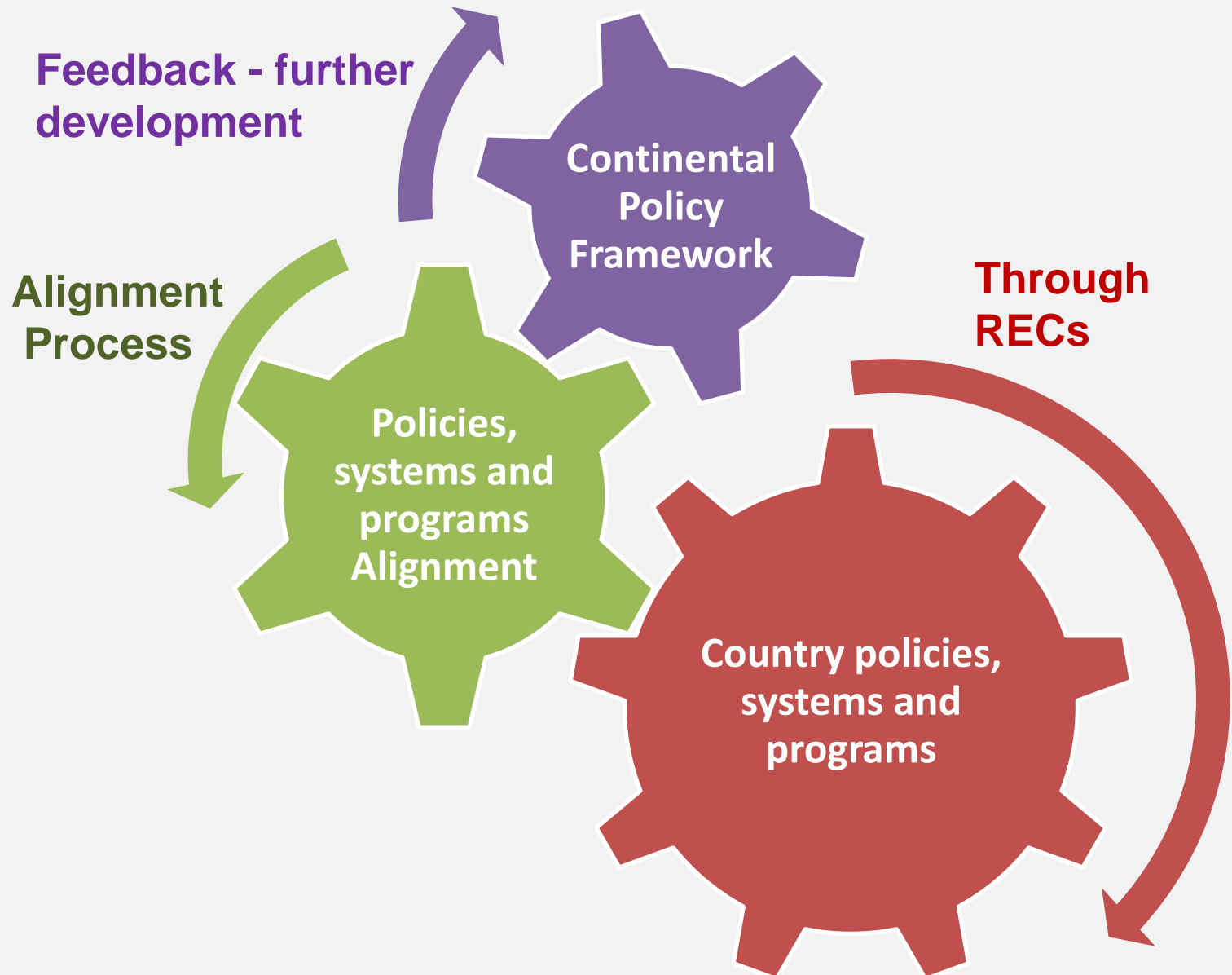
The current role of NEPAD in TICAD is to **provide strong advocacy** and, through the AU, **mobilize resources to aid the process**.

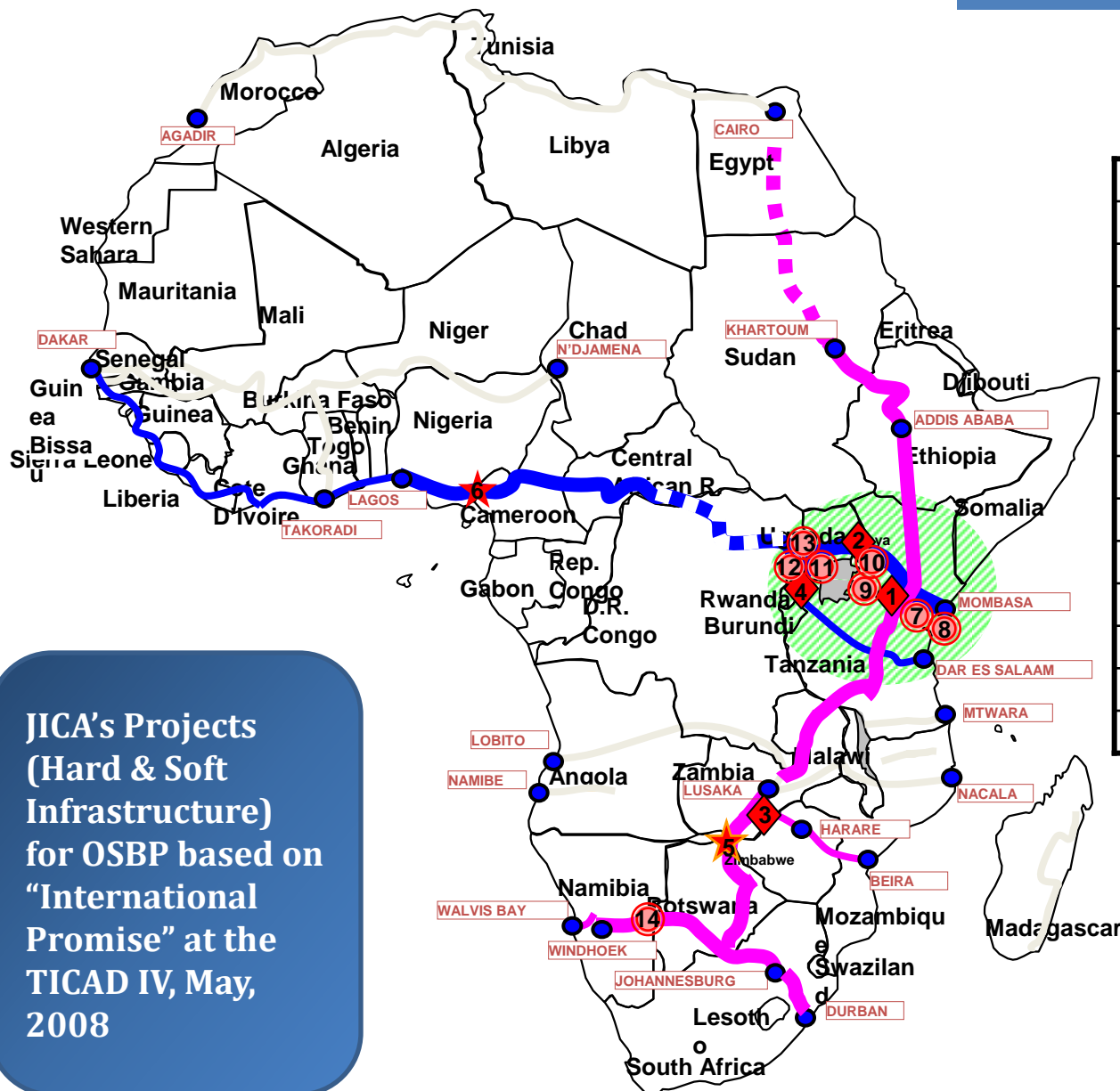
