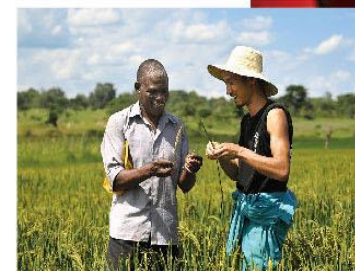

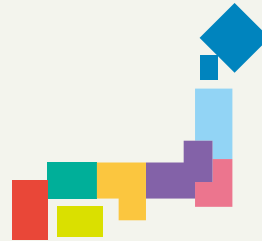

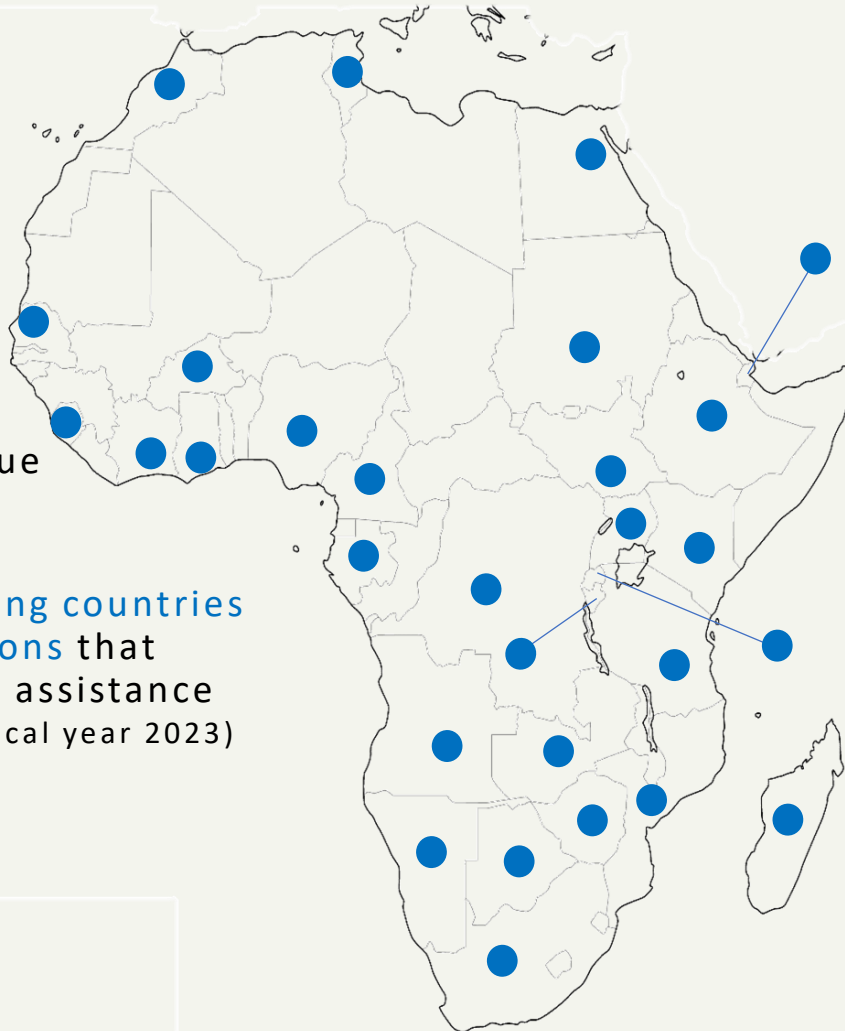

TICAD — A Multilateral Platform for Africa

- Summit-level international conference on Africa’s development initiated by Japan in 1993.
- Co-organizer: the Government of Japan, UN, UNDP, World Bank, and AUC.
- 2023 marked its 30th year anniversary.

TICAD 8

- TICAD8 was hosted by Tunisia August 27-28.

<Summary of Tunis Declaration>

- The potential of Africa is a driving force of global growth. “Investment in people” is urgent and important.
- Recognizing importance of multilateralism. Commitment to working together based on international law including the UN Charter, and respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity of all countries. Emphasizing that all countries must seek peaceful resolution of disputes in accordance with international law.
- Taking good note of the initiative of a Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP).

TICAD 9 is coming soon!

- TICAD9 will be hosted by Yokohama, Japan August 20-22.
- Three pillars of TICAD9 are “**Economy**”, “**Society**”, and “**Peace and Stability**”
- The important keywords are “Co-Creation”, “Youth” and “Start-up”.
- The robust **Leadership** to lead Co-Creation between Africa and Japan is needed!

“Model African Union Conference” (Model AU)

Organized by the Model AU Executive Committee and co-sponsored by the UNDP, Sophia University and JICA.

More than 100 university students discussed climate change and green economy playing roles as representatives of African countries in a setting modeled after the AU General Assembly, the decision-making body of the African Union (AU).



Africa-Japan Youth Drive: The Co-creation of the Future We Want

Africa Asia Youth Nest (AAYN) and Africa Diaspora Network Japan (ADNJ), youth groups in Africa and Japan, have been working towards a “youth proposal” for TICAD 9, co-sponsored by the UNDP, UNV and JICA.

In order to further deepen their proposals, we have decided to organize this event.



Economic Development Initiatives in TICAD's 30-years history

Agriculture and Food Security

■ NERICA (New Rice for Africa)



Since 1996, JICA promotes a new high-yielding rice variety that is adapted to local conditions in Africa.

■ CARD (Coalition for African Rice Development)

Launched at TICADIV in 2008. Phase2 launched at TICAD7 on 2019.



Phase1 successfully doubled rice production from 14 to 28 million tons/year in 10 years (2008 – 2018) in Sub-Sahara Africa. Phase 2 aims to redouble rice production from 28 to 56 million tons/year by 2030. 32 African countries participated

■ SHEP (Smallholder Horticulture Empowerment & Promotion)

2013: Launched at TICADV



SHEP, which has doubled farmers' income in Kenya, Malawi etc., extends to 28 African countries.

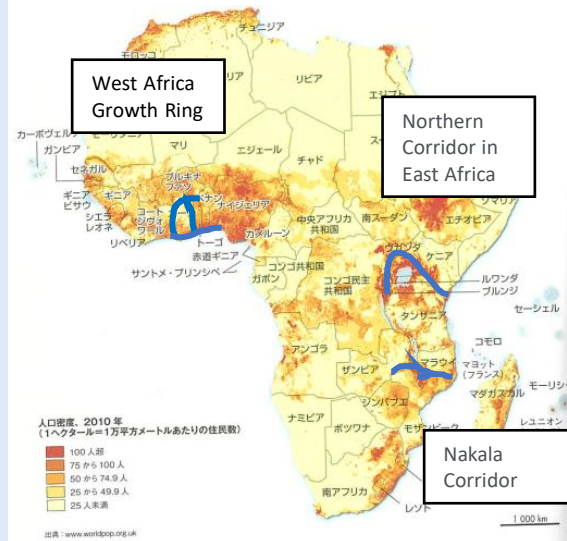
Corridor Development

■ One Stop Border Post (OSBP)



JICA supports 14 OSBPs to promote regional integration and trade facilitation thru simplifying border control procedures

Human Resource Development for Business and Industry

■ Vocational Training

JICA supports vocational training projects in Senegal, Uganda, etc.

■ ABE Initiative

Launched at TICAD V in 2013

For developing industrial human resource of youth and bridges between Japan and Africa on the business field, about 1,900 youth took Master Degree in 87 Universities in Japan.



■ Africa KAIZEN Initiative

2016: Launched at TICADVI as Continental-level Initiative



KAIZEN supports African SMEs to improve their productivity and competitiveness

The above Initiatives have trained over 300 thousands of human resource since TICAD7 in 2019

Health and Nutrition

■ Laboratories and Research Institutes for Infectious Disease Prevention



JICA and its partner institutes in Africa have been collaborating to combat with infectious diseases, particularly Covid-19.

■ Maternal and Child Health



Mother and Child Health Handbook programs in 29 countries around the world, including Africa.

■ UHC: Universal Health Coverage

2013 : Launched at TICADV



Strengthening health insurance institutions to secure access to health service for all the people

■ IFNA: Initiative for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa

2016 : Launched at TICADVI



Partnership with 10 partners such as AUDA-NEPAD to improve Nutrition from Food and Agriculture

Over 1.9 million African people have got access to health service, and over 40,000 health workers have been trained since TICAD7 in 2019

Education

■ Skilling-up Mathematics and Science Teachers

2008 : Launched at TICADIV



100,000 teachers trained to skill-up their teaching method in math and science between 2008-2012

■ "School for All" to promote school management through community participation



70,000 schools in 9 countries are joining "School for All" initiative to improve quality of education in reading, writing and mathematics

Over 6 million children have benefitted opportunities to receive better quality of education since TICAD7 in 2019

Water and Environment

■ Access to Safe Water

2008: Launched at TICADIV

JICA supported constructing water supply facilities and training over 5,000 staff, to secure access to safe water for over 6.5 million people (2008-2012).



■ Water Security Action Team

2008: Launched at TICADIV

272 volunteers were dispatched to 21 countries (2008-2020) to work on the ground for people in rural areas

■ ACCP: African Clean City Platform: 2016: Launched at TICADVI



With support from JICA, UNEP, UN-Habitat, City of Yokohama, 164 cities in 45 countries are joining to share and learn their experience of solid waste management.

Peace and Stability Initiatives in TICAD's 30-year History

Reconstruction in Post-Conflict Countries Support for Refugees and Internally Displaced People

■ Rwanda

Supporting reconstruction efforts from the genocide **to facilitate “African Miracle” recovery and growth**, such as Vocation Training for disarmed soldiers and youth



■ Uganda

Capacity Building of host community in Northern Uganda, which receive refugees from neighboring countries including South Sudan



■ South Sudan

Supporting multisectoral development for stabilization of South Sudan.



Eg: “Freedom Bridge” over Nile River in Juba, completed following 10 years of civil works disrupted three times by conflicts and pandemic. **Completion Ceremony was held in May 2022 with President Kir, First Vice-President Machar, and JICA President Tanaka**

Eg: JICA supports **National Unity Day’s Sports Event to strengthen trust and solidarity** among South Sudanese people

Governance / Rule of Law

■ Local Governance

Strengthening ties between government and people with trust in Cote d’Ivoire through building local government administrative capacity



■ Police Enforcement

Joint Police Training Program in Democratic Republic of Congo with MONUSCO for peace keeping and human security in fragile governance



■ Marine Security

Strengthening Marine Security in Djibouti through building capacity of coast guard and providing patrol boats



JICA's contribution to Agenda 2063 collaborated with AUDA-NEPAD

•Regional Integration

Accelerating Africa's Regional Integration through the African Infrastructure Development Programme (PIDA)

•Africa KAIZEN Initiative (AKI)

Contributing to industrialization and industrial structural transformation, through quality and productivity improvement through kaizen

•Initiative for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa (IFNA)

Planning and implementation of cross-sectoral projects that take into account excess and deficiency of nutrients

•Home Grown Solutions Accelerator Program (HGS)

Contributing to the resolution of social issues through the development of domestic private companies in the healthcare sector, etc.

•Policy Bridge Tank (PBT)

Contributing to the accumulation of knowledge in African countries by promoting knowledge sharing and networking among African research institutes
