Strengthening and Expanding the Mentoring Service for Small and **Medium Enterprises in the Western Balkans**

Scheme: **Technical Cooperation Project Period: January 2022 – January 2026**

Counterpart organization: **Ministry of Economic Development, Montenegro**

This regional project (Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro and North Macedonia) is a continuation of the successful cooperation in mentoring of small and medium sized enterprises, which Montenegro has been the part of since 2006. Building upon the achievements over the past years and promoting regional collaboration, the current project aims to upgrade the quality, magnitude, and sustainability of the standardized men-

toring service in the Western Balkan countries. While financial support is essential, non-financial assistance such as mentoring service is equally



crucial for the success of SMEs. So far, about 160 small and medium enterprises have used the mentoring service in Montenegro.

Sustainable Tourism **Development in the Western** Balkans (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia)

Scheme: **Technical Cooperation Project Period:** October 2024 to October 2026 Counterpart organization: **Ministry of Foreign Trade** and Economic Relations

The Western Balkan region has diverse cultures and rich tourism resources. In 2019, 12 million people visited the region, generating the profit of EUR 7.2 billion for the entire region. Tourism is an important sector that accounts for 10.2% of GDP in the region. However, insufficient tourism infrastructure, tourism workers, and lack of connectivity between the tourist destinations in the region are some of the recognized issues. The project, therefore, aims at strengthening regional cooperation and promoting sustainable tourism in the region through the dispatching of an expert who will work closely with the ministries and tourism sector personnel in the Western Balkans.

Project on Capacity building for Disaster Risk Reduction through Montenegrin Forest **Fire Information System and Eco-DRR (MEFFIS)**

The purpose of this project is to strengthen the capacities of the state institutions in the prevention and mitigation of forest fires and other natural disasters by establishing Montenegro Forest Fire Information System (MEFFIS) and promoting Ecosystem-based Disaster Risk Reduction (Eco-DRR). Eco-DRR in coastal forest in Ulcinj which protects against flying sand, wind and tides, prevents disasters caused by storm surges, presents a place for health and recreation and preserves biodiversity. Eco-DRR in Kolašin focused on planting of 9500 seedlings of spruce and 500 seedlings of black pine, slope terracing, assisted natural regeneration and soil scarification.

Capacity Building in International Law and Policy Formation for Cybersecurity

With the increasing threat of cybercrime, international collaboration and cooperation among law enforcement agencies has become essential, as well as strengthening the capacity of law enforcement agencies in each country to promote the rule of law in cyberspace. In this KCCP, the participants learn how the Japanese police deals with cybercrime in terms of investigation technique, legislation, cooperation with the private sector and digital forensics. The program also provides the opportunity to strengthen collaboration and cooperation between the national police of Japan and participating countries. Two participants from Ministry of Public Administration from Montenegro participated in this training course from September to October 2024. Due to high interest of the Montenegrin Government, the Knowledge Co-Creation Program (KCCP) "Countermeasures Against Cybercrime" will be organized again next year.
