HANDOVER CEREMONY FOR THE PROJECT FOR COUNTERING THE INFECTIOUS DISEASES INCLUDING COVID 19 HELD AT INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC HEALTH OF ALBANIA

n November 18, a handover Ceremony for JICA Technical Cooperation "Project for Countering the Infectious Diseases including Covid 19" was held at the Institute of Public Health of Albania.

The Minister of Health and Social Protection, Mrs. Ogerta MANASTIRLIU, the Ambassador of Japan in Albania, Mr. TAKADA

Mitsuyuki, the Chief Representative of the JICA Balkan Office, Mr. UEKI Masahiro as well as the General Director of the Institute of Public Health, Eugena TOMINI, attended the Handover Ceremony, where 12 different vehicles and other equipment worth 600,000 EUR, were provided by JICA to the Institute of Public Health.

In addition to the acquired equipment, this project contributed to increasing the knowledge of human resources where more than 30 specialists of public health were trained online in the prevention and control of infectious diseases.

On December 14, Faculty of Philology, University of Belgrade hosted 4th lecture of JICA Chair Program on Modernization of Japan titled "Intellectual and Social Aspects of Modernization in Japan". The lecture focused on the character of political thought and its social background at the early stage of modernization of Japan by presenting a picture of continuity and change from the Tokugawa Shogunate period to the twentieth century. Professor MATSUDA Koichiro currently teaches at Graduate School of Law and Politics and College of Law and Politics, Department of Politics at Rikkyo University, Japan.

ALBANIA MID-TERM SEMINAR FOR DIVJAKE KARAVASTA NATIONAL PARK PROJECT

n November 9, National Seminar for presenting the progress of the JICA Project "On Capacity Building for the Improvement of Ecosystem-Based Management in the Divjakë Karavasta National Park" was held in Tirana. The aim of the National Seminar was to present the progress of the project so far, as well as to discuss further steps for the full application of the Ecosystem-Based Management approach in protected natural areas.

During the seminar, the Japanese experts and the Albanian counterparts from the Regional Agency of Protected Areas of the Fier District for the Divjakë-Karavasta National Park, presented the achievements of the activities for all the components of the project so far, such as the monitoring of biodiversity, the examination of sustainable fishing, the development of environmental education, the examination of eco-tourism,

the study of the dynamics of the coast and the issue of sediments, the promotion of sustainable agriculture as well as for the monitoring of habitats and the identification of plant species.

The seminar was attended by the repre-

HAND-OVER FOR DRAGASH LANDFILL AND BROD VILLAGE

n 17 November, the official ceremony for the equipment handover for "The Project for Enhancement of Capacity for Waste Management toward Sound Material-Cycle Society Phase 2" was held in Dragash. JICA Balkan Office Chief Representative Mr. UEKI Masahiro attended the ceremony with other distinguished guests such as Chargé d'Affaires ad interim of the Embassy of Japan in Kosovo Mr. YAMANAKA Keisuke, Dragash Mayor and the representatives from the Municipality.

The equipment donated for Dragash landfill includes a truck scale and heavy works for the rehabilitation of the landfill, such as removal of waste with bulldozers, compaction of waste with bulldozers, over 6000 cubic meters of soil coverage and soil compaction with cylinder.

The donation for improvement of the waste collection system in Brod village included construction of waste collection point, provision of 16 metal containers for waste and provision of 1.5 tons dumper with wheels and container with unloading bucket.

Training for distribution, compression and coverage for proper landfill management was also conducted in three phases.

INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR FOR BELGRADE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

On November 24, the Project for Modernization of Public Transportation in the City of Belgrade organized a one-day seminar "Development trends in public transport". This year, the topic of the seminar was "Contractual relations and public-private partnership between the City and the carrier".

The seminar was divided into two parts. In the first part, the guest speakers and hosts (Secretariat for Public Transport and JICA) introduced the audience to the organization of public transport, models and the method of awarding contracts in their cities. Panel discussion was led by Dr. Predrag Živanović, professor at the Faculty of Transportation in Belgrade, while the representatives of the International Association for Public Transport (Union Internationale des Transports Publics - UITP), Bucharest, Madrid and Hamburg and Professor Dr. Vuk Bogdanović - Faculty of Engineering, University of Novi Sad took part in the panel discussion.

One of the activities of PROMOD is the improvement of work monitoring (contrac-

tual relations) of operators. This topic is currently discussed all over the world, especially after the changes in public transport under the influence of the pandemic caused by the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

From January 16 to 26, seven representatives of Secretariat for Public Transport in the city of Belgrade (SfPT) attended the Training for Modernization of Public Urban Transport in Japan.

Public urban transportation system in Belgrade is facing challenges at operational level in terms of planning and monitoring as well as with limited budget resources for its improvement.

This Project aims to increase public management capacity of SfPT, improve the ticketing system and the service level of the operators. This training was a great opportunity for the representatives of the Secretariat of Public Transport to be acquainted with all modes of transport in Japan (railway traffic, public and local bus lines, river traffic, as well as rope transport). In their future work, the participants of the training course will try to transfer gained knowledge from Japan and to implement it in the development of modernization of public transport in Belgrade.

PROGRESS OF THE "PROJECT FOR STRENGTHENING AND EXPANDING OF SME MENTORING SERVICES IN WESTERN BALKAN COUNTRIES"

Duilding upon the achievements over the past 10 years and promoting regional collaboration, JICA continued to support Western Balkan countries (Bosnia and Hercegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia) in maintaining and strengthening mentoring service for small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

Mr. Slobodan Stijepovic, the applicant for this SFU project, participated in JICA KCCP "Adaptation to Climate Change" in JFY2016 and used this opportunity through Alumni association of Montenegro to implement his idea and contribute to the environment conservation in Montenegro. In November 2022, all counterparts from the region gathered at the Overall Coordination Meeting (OCM) in Belgrade to discuss regional cooperation and

share progress and achievements in each country together with and representatives from JICA Headquarters and JICA Balkan Office. OCM is one of the crucial mechanisms in strengthening a regional cooperation.

In order to improve quality of providing mentoring service and to promote networking, all mentors meeting was organized in North Macedonia, BiH (Republika Srpska), Montenegro and Serbia. Mentors had opportunity to exchange their experience and discuss about challenges. Additionally, best mentors were awarded in North Macedonia and Montenegro.

The classroom training material for new mentors were upgraded by a working group of trainers in Serbia, Development Agency of Serbia (RAS), and Japanese experts and North Macedonia was the first to utilize new training curriculum.

KAIZEN as a basis for Japanese business philosophy, which means continues improvement, became a favorite in all companies throughout the Balkan region. Presence of Japanese experts and their advice in continuing improvement in enterprises is very much appreciated and needed especially in countries where SME sector plays significant part in overall economy. A basic KAIZEN seminar has been provided in North Macedonia and Montenegro, while set of Advance KAIZEN training sessions will be organized in upcoming period in other countries as well.
