

Objectives


The acceptance of Technical Training Participants Program involves the transfer of knowledge and technology required by respective countries through the training of key administrators, technicians and researchers in developing countries and regions. This is the most fundamental human development program implemented by JICA.

The program has grown steadily not only in scale but also in terms of content since its launch in 1954. JICA has been working on training related to global issues, including the environment and HIV/AIDS, and new issues such as support for democratization and transitions to market economies. The program also offers trainings in such basic development fields as administration, public works, agriculture, forestry and fisheries, education, health and medical care, mining, and industry.

JICA Bhutan Office coordinates the training programs between JICA training centers in Japan and the Government of Bhutan.
