ICA is pleased to welcome back the first Japan Overseas **Cooperation Volunteers** (JOCV) to Botswana following almost two years of a temporary halt to their activities due to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

The volunteer, Mr. Yusuke Kaneda who was previously working at Chobe District Council under Community Development, arrived in Botswana on 2nd March 2022 to a very warm welcome at JICA Botswana Office as well as their partners who have been instrumental in the JOCV cooperation throughout its existence.
