Program Outline	This course is designed to provide students with a critical and practical opportunity to learn about Japan's international development assistance and the history and current state of industrial policy and economic development in the Asia Pacific region, including Japan, from an international comparative perspective with international students from a variety of countries and regions. By doing so, it is hoped that the students will become top leaders who, after returning to their home countries in the future, will play a central role in developing countries' policy making and administration based on Japan's development experience.
Outline of Subjects	<p>“International Development Assistance Policy”</p> <p>This semi-intensive course provides students with a diverse overview of Japan's international development assistance policy and practice of the Japanese government, business actors and civil society organizations based on actual cases. The course gives students an opportunity to learn about economic development in collaboration with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) under the Development Studies Programme. Each module will be led by guest lecturers who are subject-matter experts and academics working on a particular issue related to the module's theme.</p> <p>Coursework will include in-class exercises, class discussions, take-home assignments and/or group work to build students' ability to understand, analyze and apply new knowledge.</p> <p>“Economic Development and Policy in the Asia-Pacific”</p> <p>This course provides the overview of political, economic, and social issues in Japan and the Asia-Pacific region, and discuss development and industrial policies from diverse aspects. This course aims to provide students with (1) the basic knowledge about historical and social contexts of the Asia-Pacific region and (2) ability to identify and discuss theoretical and analytical frameworks used in key literature in the following fields: history, political economy, urban development, and rural sociology.</p>
