Outline of	"International Development Assistance Policy"
Subjects	This semi-intensive course provides students with a diverse overview of Japan's
	international development assistance policy and practice of the Japanese
	government, business actors and civil society organizations based on actual cases.
	The course gives students an opportunity to learn about economic development in
	collaboration with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) under the
	Development Studies Programme. Each module will be led by guest lecturers who
	are subject-matter experts and academics working on a particular issue related to
	the module's theme.
	Coursework will include in-class exercises, class discussions, take-home
	assignments and/or group work to build students' ability to understand, analyze and
	apply new knowledge.
	"Economic Development and Policy in the Asia-Pacific"
	This course provides the overview of political, economic, and social issues in Japan
	and the Asia-Pacific region, and discuss development and industrial policies from
	diverse aspects. This course aims to provide students with (1) the basic knowledge
	about historical and social contexts of the Asia-Pacific region and (2) ability to
	identify and discuss theoretical and analytical frameworks used in key literature in
	the following fields: history, political economy, urban development, and rural
	sociology.
