Outline of Subjects	<p>“International Negotiation”</p> <p>This course will introduce students to fundamental concepts (theory and practice) of negotiation. The course starts with fundamentals universal to negotiation and includes topics necessary for interacting in Japan, internationally, and with International Development Agencies.
