PROGRAM OUTLINE

This program aims to build future leaders who can design mutual development in Japan and developing countries based on Japanese experiences in international cooperation. This education program is reconstructed around existing Masters' Programs in Kyoto University with a focus on sustainable development.



COURSE SUBJECTS

International Negotiation

- Introduction to fundamental concepts (theory and practice) of negotiation
- Practices of interacting in Japan, internationally, and with international development agencies
- Toolbox of negotiation and practical application skills

Integrated Approaches for Sustainable Development

- Basic viewpoints and knowledge required for environmental leadership for resolution of environmental issues in developing countries
- Practical case studies of international environmental projects
