Minute 01/2020 – A word of Prayer

A word of prayer was said by Engineer [REDACTED] and the meeting was officially opened.

Minute 02/2020 - Self introduction:

- Engineer [REDACTED] introduced the team from the Ministry of Agriculture,
- Team from the Ministry of Gender Labour, and Social Development,
- Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs, Ministry of Water and Environment, Ministry,
- Ministry of Local government and Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development.

Andrew Okori on the Consultant side introduced his team of consultants. The district of Bulambuli also introduced the team which was in the meeting and the same applied to the Kween district. Lastly the Grievance Redress Committee members introduced themselves to the meeting.

Minute 03/2020 Remarks from Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries (MAAIF)

Engineer [REDACTED] thanked everybody for creating time to attend this very important meeting despite all the hardships the country is going through due to covid-19. He informed the meeting the purpose of the meeting is to share ideas. We are in the process of acquiring land where our irrigation scheme is going to be constructed using a grant from Japan. JICA put a pre-condition that before they start the construction of the irrigation scheme, the Government of Uganda should pay off the affected persons.

However, we do have some challenges which are making our work slow. You find a PAP does not have all the required documents for verification. We have to put that file aside until that one document is got. When we insist that we need this and that, it is a requirement we have to meet before passing your file to MAAIF.

An arrangement was made when the PACC Chairpersons were able to contact two banks, Tropical Bank and Finance Trust Bank to come and camp at the project area, this greatly eased our work. Many PAPs were able to open up bank accounts there and then. Other PAPs had issues opening up bank accounts, there was a communication from the Ministry to pay them through E-Cash. There was also a challenge in this as some people had mobile phone which were not registered in their names and yet we wanted simcards in their names.

Vulnerable conditions: One PAP was identified who is bed ridden and cannot come to our office for verification. Our duty is to help the vulnerable. One of our staff member visited the sick PAP in person and verified her on her bed. This PAP is being taken care of by her nine year old son who is also under age to follow up on his mother's compensation money. It was noted that this file needs special attention from the MAAIF.

There are other two vulnerable PAPs who needed help from the Consultant, these are illiteracy and advanced age. They were helped to acquire sim cards in their names though they don't own mobile phones. When the money is paid, they will borrow phones from relatives and access their money and may be buy phone sets for themselves.

We have court cases that our legal team is handling at the moment, Yusuf Mutembule Company Advocates, case was dismissed. It affects 57 persons and others, so who are those others. There is also a case of the Moslem land verses Nyangas Simon which needs special attention.

A few re-survey cases reported of which some have been handled already. We continue to encourage those PAPs who have not come to us to do so and find out what is due to them.

We have held formal meeting with the Sub-county chiefs, LC 3 of the two districts. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] – Legal counsel of the Consultant: GRC you are appointed on your integrity, don't allow yourselves to be used by one party. Your advice will not be taken and this will derail the project and will not progress.

We allow all parties to come and present their sides of the story. Don't allow to be bought with money, that is criminal. The project now depends on GRC, if we resolve the grievances fast, the contractor comes in. We all know that we may not solve all grievances at once but the most important thing is how do we make the owner of the land to allow the contractor to start work.

Compensation will not be paid out to any one until they resolve the issues at hand but the project should go on.

Minute 06/2020 - Discussions

[REDACTED] – Senior Environmental Officer – Kween District

The river Atari has a buffer zone which is currently not visible. The water was diverted in the Kween side. I want to be clear when construction is done, 30 meters on either side, construct the dykes when there is flooding .

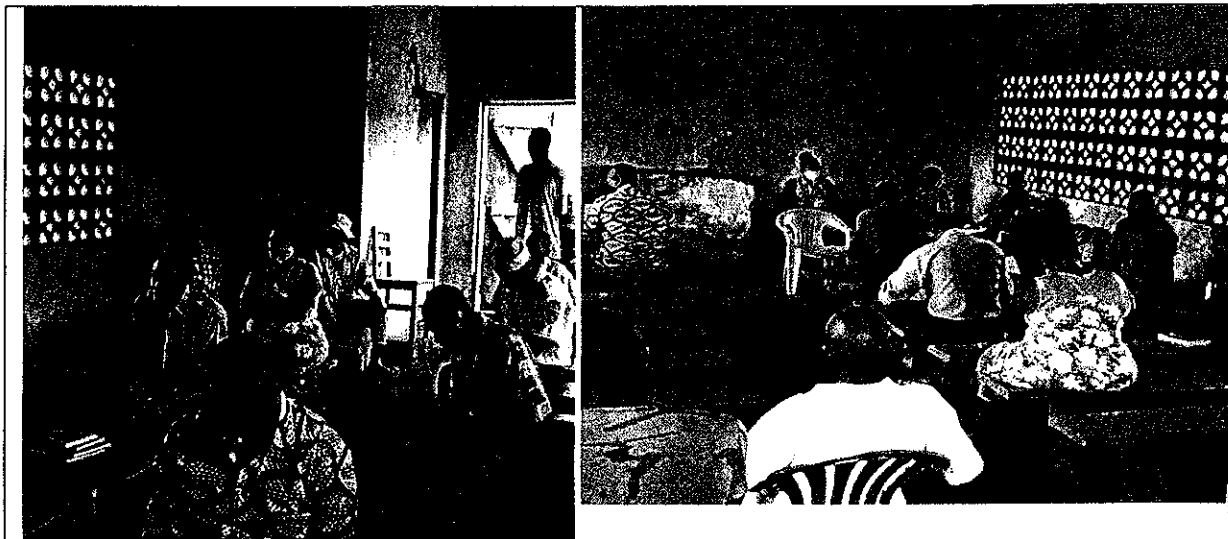
We don't expect any activity on the buffer zone. Disposal of the waste during construction should be discouraged during construction. This might harm the farmers or even their children if waste is disposed anyhow. It might also be chemicals which will in term harm human beings.

This was a courtesy call on the side of the Consultant as we had not met her since we began sensitization and verification in the sub-county.

Ms. [REDACTED] welcomed the team to Bimufuni sub-county and promised to work together with the team to make sure that everything goes on well during the exercise. She said that she has been attending the stakeholders' meeting for the project. She noted that the people had lost hope for compensation due to the long time it has taken.

She warned the team about wrong people who go on lying to the community that the money is too much for compensation. She further promised to talk to the problematic persons whom she knows personally who might sabotage the process.

Ms. [REDACTED] promised the team of her support and promised to come over to the office and witness what the consultant is doing.

Mr. [REDACTED] thanked the LC3 for receiving the team on a short notice. He further explained to her about the project and the stage the team is on of acquiring land for the irrigation scheme. Mr. [REDACTED] emphasized that what government is doing is adding value to peoples land and not grabbing it as many assume. Once the project takes off, everything in Atari will change for the best. We are continuing to sensitize the community as we verify their documents.

The LC 3 closed the meeting by thanking government of Uganda by choosing Bimufuni to have a model irrigation scheme which will benefit the whole country. She further thanked the team for the visit and promised to keep on talking to her people too as it is election period.

5. 4 copies of recent passport photograph. In case one has more than one land parcel, you are required to bring more photos. 4 photos are one piece of land, so if you have 3 more pieces of land being taken by the project, then you will have to bring 12 photos.
6. Payment of cash less than 200,000/= will be paid to the beneficiaries through their mobile phone. The phone must be registered in the correct names of the PAPs.

There are four levels of Grievance Redress Committees: Level One – headed by LC1, Level Two headed by LC3, Level Three headed by the District Lands Officer and Level Four – Courts of Law,

The formation of these GRCs will be accompanied by sensitization meetings to sensitize the PAPs on the purpose and usefulness of the GRCs. The PAPs will be encouraged to channel their grievances to the said committees. In case they would not be satisfied, they will be free to use other legal channels available. The grievance redress and resettlement committees will be established before land acquisition and compensation of PAPs begins.

Minute 05/10/2020 Matters Arising:

Qtn: [REDACTED]: The Consultant has said that we should open bank accounts, why should we open bank accounts before we know how much we shall be paid.

Ans: [REDACTED]: You can only open bank accounts after you have been disclosed to because some PAPs with less money will be paid through e-cash through mobile phones. .

Qtn: [REDACTED]: Land disputes need to be sorted out when both parties are present.

Ans: [REDACTED]: We have taken note of that, thank you.

Qtn: [REDACTED]: Will government of Uganda sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the people of Kween before taking our land?

Ans: [REDACTED]: government of Uganda will not make a MoU with the PAPs because the 3 forms that you will sign are already binding between the PAPs and government.

Qtn: [REDACTED]: I have never been to a bank, and now you want me to have an account. If my payment is one million, do I really need to open an account with all costs involved, transport, bank charges etc.

Ans: [REDACTED]: [REDACTED], one can be put in your phone, but we shall consult with our bosses and get back to you on this.

Qtn: [REDACTED]: Some of our phone numbers are registered in the names of our relatives, friends and wives. You say that the names of the phone should correspond with my documents for payment. How will MAAIF confirm that the money has been received by the right person?

Ans: [REDACTED]: The registered name of the phone should correspond with the names we have for payment.

Minute 03/10/2020 - [REDACTED] (representing Mr. [REDACTED] PACC Chairperson).

I highly appreciate the chance given to me to stand in for my Chairman Mr. [REDACTED] as I am the Secretary for PACC Bulambuli. Many of these people have been expecting things to do with money. I expect everybody here to have the pink assessment form given to you by the Valuer then.

We are grateful to the Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries (MAAIF) which considered Atari for an Irrigation Scheme which is significant in the development of the two Districts of Bulambuli and Kween. We are willing to give all the support needed to ensure the project succeeds.

This meeting is meant for the Project Affected Persons (PAPs) but I can see people who are not PAPs here who should just listen without contribution. I call upon the PAPs to listen and ask questions that really matter to the project. I now call upon the Consultant to come address the meeting.

Minute 04/10/2020 [REDACTED]:

Thank very much for the opportunity to talk to you this afternoon and I thank you for coming in such a big number. First and foremost, I would like to reiterate the message we got from the RDC Bulambuli regarding covid-19. Wash your hands with soap frequently, wear a face mask, use sanitizers always and keep a distance of about 2 meters apart. Many of you don't have face masks but I request that our next meeting, please wear a face mask provided by GoU, and if you don't have the one of government, please buy one for yourself.

I know that most of you here know as to why we are here this afternoon. We are part of a bigger team from Katuramu and Company, contracted by the Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries to carry out the RAP Implementation of Atari Irrigation Scheme. For successful implementation of the project, there is need for in depth mobilization and sensitization at all levels from Village, Sub-county and District level.

Sensitization activities are conducted though more are still needed to help communities understand that the project is not about land take. The project is here to add value to your land. Construction will not start before compensation is complete.

As we start the verification exercise on Thursday 8th October, we shall require everybody to come with either of the following items:

7. Original National Identity card. Voter's card, Driver's Permit or Passport. For those who don't have any of these, you will be required to get an introductory letter from your village Chairman 1, signed by the Local Council 3 and also endorsed by the District CAO confirming that you are the real person to be paid.
8. We shall require from you sales agreements for your lands. The purpose of this is for us to ascertain the correct owner of the said land. You will agree with me that most land ownership in this region is entirely customary. Land belongs to clans. If one has no land

Ans: [REDACTED]: You must have a head of clan in the family who can confirm that this piece of land was given to you by either your grandfather or father, plus LC1 and a neighbor.

Qtn: [REDACTED]: My father sold 74 acres of land to Simanyi Benson but he has grabbed land to a tune of 110 acres. I want the project to help me get back our land.

Ans: [REDACTED]: You should come to our grievance desk and record your case during verification which starts on Thursday 8th October,

Qtn [REDACTED] His land is one acre. The road and canal pass in the middle of his land. The land that is left on either sides cannot sustain his family. Will the contractor buy even those small pieces?

Ans: [REDACTED]: This can be looked into by Government

Qtn: [REDACTED]: Will I be able to access my land where I grow food for my family during construction period?

Ans: No because I will not be safe for you and your family to go to that piece land as the construction goes on due the heavy machinery which might cause accidents. This is why GoU is paying you a disturbance allowance of 30% to enable you feed your family during this period. Furthermore, the contractor will work in bits and very fast, he closes an area and finishes fast and goes to another part as he opens the one he has finished. So you will not take a long time without going back to cultivate your land.

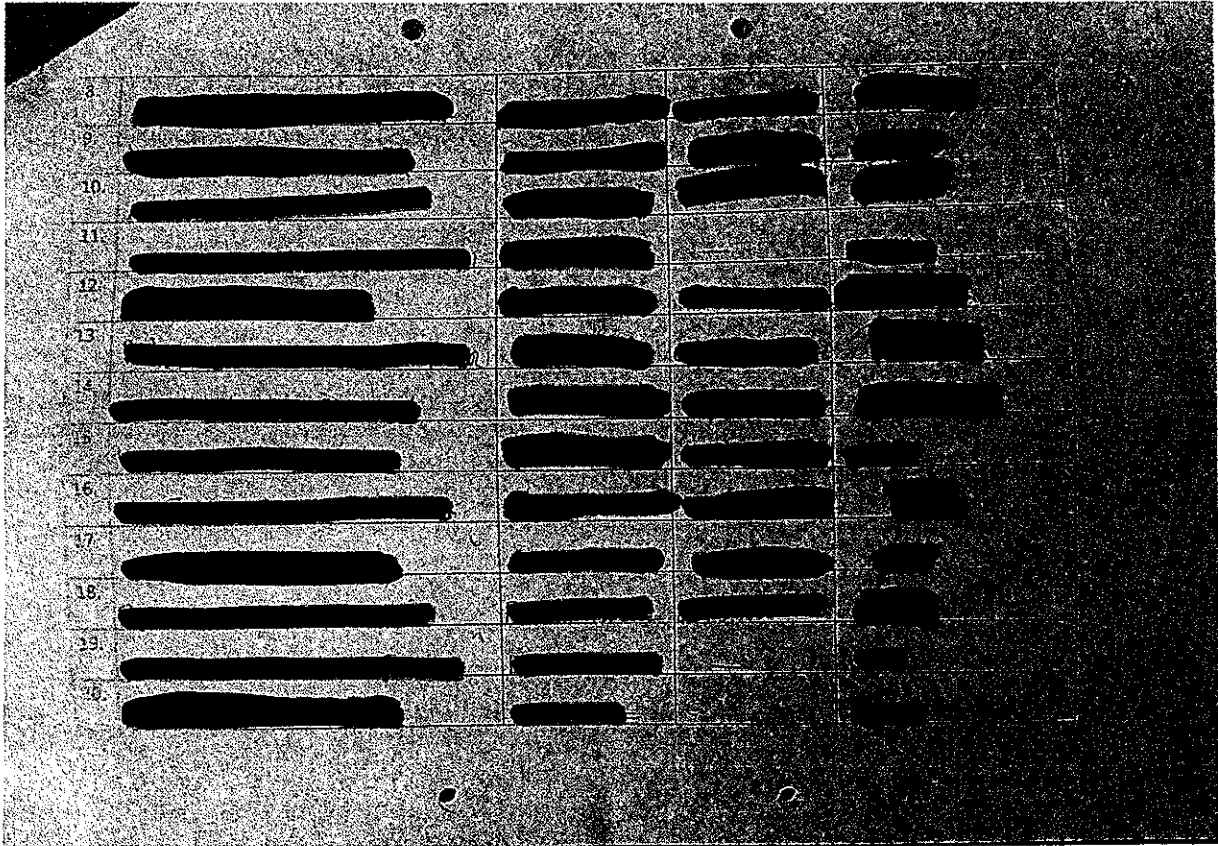
Minute 06/10/2020 Closing Remarks

It is good that you already have a team in the district which is well versed with the project. With land acquisition, we shall start by mobilization and sensitization. We have already got a direction from the district DISO regarding covid-19.

We have a time table of activities which we have shared with the Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries Project Manager, which will be announced to the stakeholders very soon.

We shall need the availability of the Lands Officer as he or she has to endorse the land document.

First meeting was held with MS [REDACTED], the Lands Officer of Bulambuli District. Engineer [REDACTED] of the Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries (MAAIF) introduced the team and told the Lands Officer that the purpose of this visit was to brief her of the progress of land acquisition process for Atari Irrigation Scheme and to root JICA safeguards which dictate that all the Project Affected Persons (PAPs) be fully compensated before the construction work begins.

Livelihood Support to the PAPs should be taken care of before payment is done. Persons growing yams in the buffer zone shall be compensated once as the yams take only six months to mature.

STEPS OF GRIEVANCE REDRESS:

A verbal or a written complaint from aggrieved person will be received by the Sociologist or a person assigned in the project as the Grievance Officer (GO) and recorded in a grievance log (electronically if possible). Grievances can be lodged at any time.

The process for lodging a complaint is outlined below:

- a. The GO will receive a complaint from the complainant.
- b. The GO will ask the claimant questions in their local language write the answers in English and enter them in English onto the Grievance Form.
- c. A representative of the community shall witness translation of the grievance into English.
- d. The local leader and the complainant both sign the Grievance Form after they both confirm the accuracy of the grievance.
- f. The GO lodges the complaint in the Grievance Log.

TASKS OF THE GRIEVANCE REDRESS COMMITTEE:

The specific tasks of the GRC will be:

- a. Set up a systematic process of recording grievances in a register (Grievance Book) as well as electronically.
- b. Both written and verbally communicated grievances should be recorded.
- c. Prepare a database for recording and keeping track of the grievances and how they were resolved. The database should be a living document, updated weekly. It should also record the status of each grievance (date opened/in-process/closed).
- e. Communicate the grievance procedure to the people, the process for recording their complaints and the timelines for redress.
- f. If the grievance does not require action by the Sociologist to resolve it, it should still be documented and included in the system for grievance tracking for further reference.

FOUR LEVELS OF GRIEVANCE REDRESS:

Level One: This will comprise of the Local council leaders, Elders, people of good reputation and who have knowledge of customs and culture of the area, PACC Chairman and the aggrieved PAP.

Level Two: Grievances not resolved by Level One, the grievance will be taken to the second level. This level will have LC3 chairperson as the Chair, PACC chairman, and PAP representative.

Level Three: If a PAP is not satisfied with level two, then the District level comes in. This involves Land Officer, PDCC, PACC chairmen, and composition of the District Land Committee

Level Four: Courts of law. When all the three levels fail to resolve a land case, then the PAP will be advised to seek legal redress which is sometimes very costly and takes a long time to resolve issues.

A record of any/all grievances received and handled will be kept at all phases of the implementation process. The Second Level will be formed and headed by the LC 3/Sub-

Grievance Redress Mechanism:

When a person raises a complaint, he needs answers. The Consultant shall work with you the affected PAPs in the project area to set up an LC1 Grievance Committee to be the first point where grievances are addressed. All attempts shall be made to settle grievances amicably before resorting to courts of law.

The GRM is to ensure that complaints on RAP Implementation are directed and expeditiously addressed by the relevant bodies. A grievance mechanism must be present and made available to PAPs who have grievances or are not satisfied with any part of the resettlement and compensation process. These grievances could relate to the unfair compensation, encumbrances amongst PAPs and their relatives, valuation of assets, amongst others. Grievances will be handled through negotiation aimed at achieving consensus. All attempts shall be made to settle grievances amicably before resort to courts of law.

FOUR LEVELS OF GRIEVANCE REDRESS:

Level One: This will comprise of the Local council leaders, Elders, people of good reputation and who have knowledge of customs and culture of the area, PACC Chairman and the aggrieved PAP.

If the PAP has no documentation of any sort regarding land ownership. Most of us have just come back to the area after the insurgency caused by the Karamojong cattle rustling. When we came back, we just sat and divided the land amongst ourselves. We don't have any documents.

Ans: [REDACTED]:

We are going to use public funds to pay PAPs. There is what is called accountability – the Auditors will want to see the documents we used to pay the PAPs. The Consultant will guide you on what to do. Leaders of Atari and neighbors know that the land belongs to you.

My husband is very far, he is the one who registered for payment. Will I be required to open another account instead of my husband to get the money?

Your husband can write for you a letter authorizing the Ministry to put money into your account.

- Acceptance receipt: Put a clause that says that the PAP has acknowledged the value after the survey and valuation to get to that amount.
- The forms lack a provision that shows whether someone is a landlord or tenant. This should be put clear.
- Include in these forms where someone from the district should sign, area land committee sign. I want to know if they are significant in this case. They have a very big say in allocation of land. Have a provision to consult them.
- Payment acknowledgment section needs to be modified; strike out LC and replace with Village LC,
- Remove the word Lease because this does not apply to land in this part of the country. Land titles/Sales agreement
- Disturbance allowance should be standard, show the value.

The District is undergoing a lot of challenges right now due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Donors have also closed taps of money hence high unemployment.

- agricultural and broader economic growth is fostered, and all in a sustainable manner.
- Irrigation reduces reliance on erratic rainfall/ droughts and increases yields;

Ans: This is why we have come with the Valuer and Surveyor to sort out such issues, so your land will be surveyed and valued this time round.

Qn: [REDACTED]: there is this issue of cultural sites in the project area, how shall the graves be compensated?

Ans: if the project is not touching the graves, then no compensation will be given, but it is ascertained that the project is passing through the graves, then relocation of the graves will be taken care of.

Qn: [REDACTED]: If a man has no national ID, can he use his wife's national ID to get his payment?

Ans: No, this will not be acceptable. That is why we have given a provision of one getting a letter from the area LC I, to LC 5 and also endorsed by CAO.

Qn: [REDACTED]: The land was surveyed last time, and today again you are coming with Surveyors and Valuers to do the same job?

Ans: We are not coming to do the same job, last time we came to identify the PAPs and survey their lands, and this time we have come to confirm the identity of the PAPs for payment.

Qn: [REDACTED]: We shall be signing the transfer of land to who?

Ans: The transfer of only the small part that the project is taking will be transferred to Government of Uganda after dully compensating you.

Qn: [REDACTED]: Chairperson LC III Sikwo: I have heard that this process will take 9 months, people have their land there, will they stop farming and harvesting their crops during the process?

Ans: The farmers will continue to use their land, when contractor comes, he will give you time like three months to harvest your crops. After receiving the money, please buy another land elsewhere if possible.

Qn: [REDACTED]: why does the consultant want us to come with our wives to sign the documents for payment?

Ans: This is done countrywide for transparency reasons, we have what is called "Environment and Social Safeguards" to make sure that the project does not leave you in a worse situation than you were before and also so that the money is used in the right way.

[REDACTED] – Chairman PACC Sikwo: Thank you all for coming. Consultant you are well come. I have been in meetings, I am here to guard my consultant who has come to help my people. I also want to thank Eng. [REDACTED] for being here with us.

At a later date Katuramu and Company will open an office in the project area to deal with the PAPs.</p> <p>The people of Atari, we want to thank you for your patience. We started this journey long ago. We expect the contractor to start his work probably next year if this RAP Implementation goes on well.</p> <p>I want to give you an update on what is happening. Along the construction project, we have what we call the Technical Project which will help us manage the water of Atari. Whoever is in the project area should have a share of the water. We want all of you to get water which means all of you should organize yourselves into an Association. We are interested in all the people of Atari to get money in their pockets. As such we must be organized to attain this.</p> <p>You remember that the RAP of this project was done in 2018 but was not completed. So this consultant is here to verify what was not done and for you who are willing to give your land to government, we thank you for that and government will pay for it.</p> <p>Katuramu and Company was competitively awarded this job. They are a representative of Government of Uganda for this project. We are working closely with the two districts and if there is anything that is not clear, you are free to consult from LC level to the district level.</p>

Qn: [REDACTED]. I am a PAP but I have a court case, so whom are you going to pay as the case is not yet decided.

Ans: If by the time of payment reaches and the case is still pending in court, the money for this piece of land will be deposited in court and the one who wins the case will take it afterwards.

Qn: [REDACTED]: If my land is in the project area but not affected, what will happen to me and my land?

Ans: You will remain with your land.

Qn: [REDACTED]: Since government is going to compensate those ones who are only affected by the project, what about the ones who are not affected?

Ans: The ones who are not affected will also benefit from the project by using the water for irrigation.

Qn: [REDACTED] JICA gave us the pink forms but why are you again asking for the sales agreements of the land?

Ans: The pink copy and sales agreements are used to confirm if you are the owner of the said land.

Qn: [REDACTED] Senior Consultant said that the government is going to take our land, can you make it clear to us.

Ans: We did not say that government is going to take your land, government is going to take just a small portion of the land that is affected by the project and you will continue using the other part of your land without any problem.

Qn: [REDACTED] the project is in two districts, what rates are you using for compensation?

Ans: we shall use rates of both districts, that is Kween and Bulambuli districts as provided by the District Lands Officers.

PACC members are not sharing information with the farmers.

Ans: It is good that PACC members are present in this meeting and we hope they work on this issue seriously.

Qn: [REDACTED] The land which was surveyed is for government or ours?

Ans: The land that was surveyed remains yours apart from that portion that the project affected is what you will transfer to government, but the big part will remain your land.

Qn: [REDACTED] I have a court case on my land, whom is government going to compensate?

Ans: This question has already been asked by [REDACTED], when the time comes for payment, the said compensation will be deposited to court and whoever wins the court case takes the money.

Qn: [REDACTED]: Is it possible for the Contractor to start the work this year. Tell us the exact time when he is to start how long is going to take to finish the whole job?

Ans: The beginning construction job will depend entirely the co-ordination the PAPs with the consultant and how fast the RAP
