Projects for which evaluation began in FY2021 or later are assessed using JICA's new project evaluation criteria, which more closely reflect the principles of the SDGs and take into account the perspectives of "Leave No One Behind" and "People's Well-Being." We have also conducted impact evaluations and "qualitative comparative analysis" that allows for easy estimation of the causal relationship between a project and its effects. Furthermore, we have started a trial evaluation for the new project management method based on the "JICA Global Agenda" (cooperation strategy for global issues). This report highlights these new efforts.

It is our hope that this report will be widely shared and will help promote a better understanding of JICA's activities. We would like to ask for your continued support and encouragement for JICA.
