Has supported SADC countries develop Food and Nutrition Security Policies, evidenced based Food Based Dietary Guidelines, Food Composition Tables and nutrition surveys. Has supported countries on nutrition sensitive Food systems transformation. Before FAO, she worked with UNICEF in Sudan as a Chief of Field Office and Nutrition Specialist. She also worked with the WHO at the Regional Office for Africa in Congo Brazzaville; OXFAM GB for Southern Africa and in academia with the University of Malawi.

In 2021, UNESCO endorsed his flagship initiative, Traditional Foodways approach, as a model of Good Safeguarding Practices for Intangible Cultural Heritage, celebrating its innovative methods and significant local and global impact.
