PROGRAM OUTLINE

The Public Administration Program at the Graduate School of Economics provides the experience and knowledge in the field of policy development in various Asian developing countries as well as in East Asian studies. This program accepts international students who primarily work within central and local governments in their respective countries in Asia and Africa and helps them acquire important skills to be able to contribute to the socio-economic development of their countries. In addition, Yamaguchi has a history of producing many human resources who supported the modernization of Japan as a place of Meiji Restoration, and international students are encouraged to learn their experiences and knowledge not only through the lectures but also through field trips to central government agencies, local governments, and SMEs in Tokyo, and by undergoing training in Okinawa.

This program helps them acquire important skills to be able to contribute to the socio-economic development of their countries. The Public Administration Program is offered entirely in English, thus providing an environment in which to pursue academic research, supported by a strong, judicious supervisory program.
