Project Summary

Development Impact & Additionality

1. Support African entrepreneurs in addressing healthcare challenges

Mr. Sangu, the founder of CarePoint, was born in Ghana and studied at Harvard University. After completing his studies, he decided to start a business aimed at improving healthcare environments in his home country, Ghana, and across Africa. The company operates hospitals and clinics that provide reliable medical services with affordable prices including low- and middle-income populations, thus they contribute to advancing Universal Health Coverage (UHC) in Africa.

2. Promote the realization of UHC & Global Health with Japan

CarePoint is a partner company of the “Impact Investment Initiative for Global Health (Triple I for Global Health)” announced in the joint statement of the G7 Hiroshima Summit in May 2023 and works with the Government of Japan to address global health challenges. Furthermore, Kepple Africa Ventures, a Japan-based venture capital firm, and M3, Inc., a Japanese company operating an online platform globally for healthcare professionals, have also formed capital partnerships with CarePoint. JICA will collaborate with the Government and Japanese society to address promoting UHC and Global Health.
