# Overview of JICA Volunteer Program


The JICA Volunteer Program dispatches Japanese citizens who are eager to engage in international cooperation based on requests from developing countries. As summarized by the phrase "together with the local community", JICA volunteers

live and work at the grassroots level, speaking the same language as the local communities and carrying out activities with an emphasis on fostering self-reliance for sustainable change. Since its first dispatch of 29 Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers to 5 countries: Laos, Cambodia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Kenya in JFY 1965, more than 57,000 volunteers have been dispatched to 99 countries and regions across a wide range of fields under the following three objectives:

- To contribute to the economic and social development, as well as the reconstruction of developing countries
- To deepen mutual understanding and coexistence in crosscultural societies
- 3 To give back the volunteer experience to society

## Case studies of ongoing volunteer activities



### Kenya / Hospital Operations and Management (Jan. 2024 to Jan. 2026)

A volunteer dispatched to a major hospital in Machakos County has been contributing to enhance the staff's work efficiency based on observations of the workflow and operations across various departments within the hospital. One specific improvement involved addressing congestion at the reception area: the volunteer introduced the use of queue poles and helped establish a system where staff members guide patients, thereby reducing the confusion and disorganization among those waiting.In addition, the volunteer has been making broader proposals including improving the procedures for procuring necessary supplies through discussions with the hospital's management.



### Cambodia / Quality Control/Productivity Improvement (May 2024 to May 2026)

A volunteer was dispatched to the Department of Civil Engineering at the National Polytechnic Institute of Cambodia. For quality control and productivity improvement, the volunteer provides guidance to both faculty and students on 5S activities ("Sort, Set in order, Shine, Standardize, Sustain") and Kaizen intiatives. The volunteer's efforts aim not only to establish these practices within the department but also to promote their adoption throughout the entire Institute. Additionally, there are plans to work on organizational development within the department and to improve manuals, including those related to safety.

# 60th Anniversary Events

JICA Volunteer Program marked its 60th anniversary in 2025, having dispatched its first group of 29 volunteers to five countries (Laos, Cambodia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Kenya) in 1965. To commemorate this milestone, JICA plans to hold various events, including a commemorative ceremony, overseas events in the initial five countries and others, and domestic events including within the EXPO2025 OSAKA, KANSAI and TICAD9. In addition, JICA will carry out collaborative projects with supporting organizations and related public relations activities.

This theme aims to express in simpler terms the concept of giving back to Japanese society through JICA Volunteer Program. And, it represents how the volunteers, while addressing various global challenges, also bring about positive change and transformation within Japanese society.

### Developing globally and domestically active human resources

- For successful volunteer candidates who are willing to engage in solving domestic issues in Japan before dispatching, opportunities are provided to gain on-the-job training (OJT) in fields such as regional revitalization and multicultural coexistence.
- This program aims to foster human resources who has strong connections with local communities in Japan and can contribute to addressing regional challenges, thereby promoting the circulation of knowledge and experience back into Japanese society.

[Program period] 2.5 months [Achievement] 276 people, 24 regions across 14 prefectures (as of March 2025)
