<p><b>Japanese Language Education Program for International Students</b></p>	<p>Please note that we do not have Japanese language course for elementally level students. Following classes are targeted to intermediate and upper level students.</p> <p>Japanese 1 and 2: Primary Japanese language class for Japanese grammar, communication skills, critical-reading, and academic-writing.</p> <p>Japanese 3: Intermediate Japanese language class for presentation in Japanese.</p> <p>Things Japanese 1, 2: This course for overseas students is an introduction to contemporary Japanese society, taught in Japanese by an American professor. Students will acquire a lot on information.</p> <p>This class is for overseas students and introduces them to Japanese Heritage Sites, the basics of Japanese religion, and the particulars of all 47 of Japan's prefectures.</p>

	<p>Following class is given in English so that prospective international students are able to gain their knowledge about Japanese history and culture.</p> <p>Japanese History and Culture: Students will review the main periods of Japanese history, with emphasis on the modern age, and consider what is important. Sir E. Tylor defined culture as “that complex whole which includes knowledge, belief, art, morals, law, custom, and any other capabilities and habits acquired by man as a member of society.” This definition is still usable. We will focus on ethnicities as a way of understanding modern Japanese society.</p>
