<p>International Students Support Center for Consulting or counseling about daily life, campus life, cross-cultural adjustment etc.</p>	<p>Physical Education and Health Care Center For our students to maintain health, this Center provides various sport facilities and suggestions relating to sport activities and health care. First aid for accidents, health check-ups, health consultations and so are also available at the Center.</p> <p>Counseling Counselors (licensed clinical psychotherapists) offer counseling as needed at Health Care Center. Counseling is to improve the students' life on campus as well as off- ; you are free to talk to counselors about any worries you may have. Your privacy and secrecy is assured.</p> <p>Center for International Exchange and Education (CIEE) and Division of International Affairs (Kokusai-ka) NUT CIEE offers courses of the language, culture, and general affairs of Japan to international students. It also offers international students guidance and counseling for their student life. Services provided by Kokusai-ka include all affairs involving international students.</p> <p>MUTSUMI-kai Besides physical and health counseling, Mutsumi-kai holds weekly counseling at International Friendship Lounge. Mutsumi-kai is a voluntary group organized to support NUT international students. Other than conducting general counseling every Wednesday, from 13:30 to 16:30.</p>
<p>Provision of Student Dormitory</p>	<p>Nagaoka University of Technology have 4 on-campus dormitories and 1 off-campus dormitory available for international students. If we have more the number of applicants than that of rooms available, residents will be decided based on our university's selection criteria.</p> <p>International House Located on campus, this house accommodates male international students, researchers and Japanese graduate students.</p> <p>International Students House Located on campus, this is a mixed dormitory for female students of both Japanese and non-Japanese nationalities.</p> <p>30th Anniversary Student House Located on campus, this new student house accommodates international students and Japanese graduate students.</p>

	<p>Student Dormitory Located on Campus, available for male Japanese undergraduate students and male international students.</p> <p>International Lodge Located off campus(about 10km apart from the university), this newest lodge is available for interantional students, researchers, and Japanese doctoral students.</p>
<p>Japanese Language Education Program for International Students</p>	<p>Japanese Classes for Beginners (Non-Credit) “Intensive Japanese” and “Basic Japanese “are prepared for those who have never studied the language. You will be practicing and learning useful expressions to communicate with others in your daily life.</p> <p>●Intensive Japanese (“KENSHU” -Course) Intensive Japanese courses are 16-week courses for students receiving scholarship from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as well as self-financed foreign Students. Starts in April and in October. 5 days a week (90min×10 per week) for 16-17 weeks.</p> <p>●Basic Japanese (“KISO” -Course) The Basic Japanese course is for foreign students and researchers who have some proficiency in Japanese. This course consists of Basic 1 (elementary-beginner)& 2 (elementary-intermediate). Starts in April and in September. 4 days a week (90min×4 per week) for 1 academic term.</p> <p>●KANJI Class (Basic / Intermediate) Starts in April and in October. Twice a week (90min×2 per week) for 1 academic term. Possible to take along the above Japanese class.</p> <p>Japanese Classes with Credits Japanese Language courses (Intermediate/Advanced) and General Affairs of Japan are offered as regular University courses, for graduate and undergraduate students, throughout the year. Before taking these courses, take placement test and register for the course as other subjects.</p>
<p>Cultural Activities</p>	<p>NUT International Students Association (NUTISA) NUTISA aims to build mutual friendship among the international students as well as the Japanese students of NUT, through annual activities like Nagaoka International Festival and dance parties.
