- Quest for Principles of Economic Activity That Are in Harmony with Humanity and Morality
 The globalization of economy are accelerating ever more rapidly. There is growing significance in

 Economics Major aims at fostering professional practitioners and researchers who are able to promote

 In the Economics Major, students theoretically and statistically analyze dynamic structural changes resulted from globalization in such factors as production and the transfer of goods and services across borders.
