
#### **Annex Building**

10 Tips for earthquake safety

#### **Protect yourself first**

- · Be prepared and protect yourself from an earthquake when you hear Warning announcement or feel a quake
- · Stay under a table until quake is gone Keep yourself from falling or moving objects during quake

Upper Floors may be shaken for several minutes.



### When you are

#### **Outside**

- · Use a bag or hand luggage to protect your head.
- · Get away from structures like concrete-block walls, and watch out for falling objects such as bricks, glass, or signboards.
