Africa/Japan Startups Pitch - Innovation & New Partnership for SDGs -

On Friday, Aug. 30, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), cosponsoring with the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), invited 24 selected startup companies from Africa and Japan to a live pitch event at PACIFICO Yokohama exhibition hall to showcase their business models that use digital technology to innovatively solve social issues.
