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China 25 Xi'an-Ankang Railway Construction Project (1)-(3)

This project's objective was to construct an electrified single-track railway line between Xi'an and Ankang in Shaanxi Province for the purpose of increasing the transportation of energy resources, freight, and passengers to northwestern and southeastern China, and thereby contribute to the economic development of these regions.

Evaluation Result

In this project, construction of an electrified single-track railway between Xi'an and Ankang (Xikang Line) (including construction and installation of tracks, roadbed, bridges, tunnels, stations, substations, communications and signal equipment, etc.) was conducted almost as planned, except that the length of the Qinling Tunnel was extended in consideration of the expected demand in the future. Project period and cost both slightly exceeded those that were planned.

Freight traffic volume and passenger traffic volume on Xikang Line in 2003 were 4,062.88 million ton-km and 1,211.36 million person-km respectively, as against 4,343.4 million tonkm and 1,142.28 million person-km planned for 2005. Passenger traffic has already exceeded the target volume. Traveling time on the Xikang Line is around 4 hours, about half of that by bus, and the railway fare is one-third of the bus fare. Thus, the Xikang Line has become an important means of transportation for local residents. Compared with the existing Baoching Line, an alternative route between Xi'an and Ankang, the transportation distance has been reduced by 542 km and traveling time has been reduced by around 14 hours, showing that convenience has increased significantly.

The Qinling Mountains, a series of 3,000-meter peaks extending over 1,500 kilometers, are covered with abundant plants and regarded as a treasury of wild animals such as ibis, panda and golden monkey. It is reported that this project had a positive impact on tourism.
