Criteria and Questions

- Criteria and questions frame M&E
- Need to get agreement from stakeholders that these are the right questions for this project at this point in time
- Many different questions can be asked
- Takes time to develop the right questions



Determining Your Evaluation Questions

- What is the purpose of your study?
 - Consider the place in the JICA operating cycle
 - Consider the goals and objectives of the project in light of sectoral and macro-level objectives
 - Consider the outputs and deliverables of the projects

Determining Your Questions

(cont'd)

What is the purpose of your study?

- Consider the process
- Consider the stakeholders
- How will the results be used?
- What is most important?

Use PDM and related documents to identify and clarify questions



Defining Your Questions

What is it you want to know?

- Who wants to know?
- Why do they want to know?
- How will the results be used?
- What is most important?



Sources of Questions

- Project documents including monitoring results and PDM
- Project, Government, JICA officials
- Project beneficiaries
- Experts
- Other studies
- Five DAC criteria (will be discussed in detail later)



Types of Questions

- Descriptive: What happened?
- Normative: Did we achieve our target?
- Impact: Did the program make a difference?



Descriptive Questions

- Seek to understand or describe a program or process.
- Provide a snapshot of what is
- Journalist's questions:
 - who, what, when, where, why, how, and how much?



Descriptive Questions

(Cont'd)

- Can be used to describe:
inputs, activities, outputs



Normative Questions

- Examine **what is...**
- Compare it to **what should be**
- Are we doing what we are supposed to be doing?
- Are we achieving our target?



Normative Questions

(Cont'd)

What happens when program objectives are unclear?

- You have to state the criteria you are going to use
- There is always a certain degree of subjectivity
- Others may not agree with your notion of how things **should be**.



Impact or Cause-Effect Questions

- **Impact or Causal questions:**
Examine the **effect** of a program

Can be used to measure:

- **project purpose (outcomes)**
- **overall goal (impact)**



Impact or Cause-Effect Questions

The *program* is the **independent variable** which is expected to *cause change* in the **dependent variable**



Causal Relationships

- Need a logical theory
- Must establish time-order
- Variables must co-vary (as the independent variables changes so does the dependent variables)
- Must eliminate all other possible rival explanations



Impact or Cause-Effect Questions

Impact or Causal questions

- are the hardest to answer!
- require special strategy to answer.



JICA's Evaluation Criteria

- Use DAC five evaluation criteria
 - Relevance
 - Effectiveness
 - Efficiency
 - Impact
 - Sustainability



These help you evaluate technical assistance projects from comprehensive perspectives



1. Relevance

- Are the project objectives still relevant? (Do they meet with the needs of beneficiaries?)
- Is the project strategy relevant to produce the expected impact on development goal or program goal?
- Does the project meet with the priority of the development policy/Japan's ODA policy?

2. Effectiveness

- Is the project achieving satisfactory progress toward its stated objectives (project purpose)?
 - **Mid-term**
- Are the expected changes observed as a result of the project?
 - **Terminal and ex-post**

3. Efficiency

- Are the services/products delivered at an acceptable cost, compared with alternative approaches?
- Is the project purpose achieved at an acceptable cost?

4. Impact

- What are the social, economic, technical, environmental and other effects on individuals, communities, and institutions as a result of the project?
- intended and unintended, positive and negative, macro and micro

5. Sustainability

- Are the activities or effects likely to be maintained after donor funding?
- Institutional/organizational aspect
- Technical aspect
- Financial aspect
- Social, environmental aspect
- Ownership, etc.



Criteria/Types of Questions

- It is important to know the types of questions we are asking within the 5 JICA criteria
- Reason: The type of question will determine the strategy we select to answer that question

Remember! There are other sources of questions besides DAC five criteria






