Part-II- Qualitative Monitoring format

- 1. In-situ Rehabilitation & Resettlement of Girgaon-Kalbadevi PAPs:
 - The preliminary study reveals that 34 buildings were getting affected due to the construction of these two metro stations now reduced to 19. Two Buildings namely Kranti Nagar and Annapurna Niwas are recently added to affected buildings making total number of affected buildings as 21.
 - Considering the local residents' demand of in-situ rehabilitation MMRC appointed M/s. Catapult Consultants to explore the feasibility of in-situ rehabilitation plan with redevelopment of existing properties.
 - M/s. Catapult conducted detailed investigation of the project affected areas and discussed with the PAP families, tenants, commercial establishments, owners and the landlords and recommended the viable scheme for in-situ rehabilitation with redevelopment using provisions of cluster development 33(7) of DCR 1991.
 - The number of PAPs have increased from 634 to 778.
 - Govt. of Maharashtra has approved the Rehabilitation Action Plan for In-situ Rehabilitation.
 - Out of 778 PAPs, No. of agreements executed- 331, of which 65 have opted for alternative transit accommodation and 266 are being paid rent. Rent is disbursed for 241 PAPs out of 266 PAPs.
 - A consultant (JV of M/s G.D.Sambhare & M/s R.H.Mahimtura) is hired for providing architectural design, structural design & project management consultancy services.

**Out of 2888 structures; 1537 are resettled, 204 PAPs are accommodated in in-situ development by developer, 177 structures Relocated in nearby vicinity with the help of BMC, and 150 are shifted from proposed Girgaon Kalbadevi metro stations.

- 2. Composition/type of participants and specific issues raised by the participants especially the vulnerable groups.
- 3. Actions/follow-up taken to address the issues raised in the public consultation Meeting
 - MMRCL has considered the issues raised in Public Consultation meeting.
- 4. Process adopted for the relocation of PAFs, religious and community structures
 - Project affected people from Sant Dnyaneshwar Nagar, BKC Metro Station no. 18 and Nayanagar, TBM Launching Map No. 20 A, Mahalaxmi, Science Museum, Dharavi, Vidyanagari, Sahar Road, Marol Naka, MIDC, Vidhan Bhavan, Suppl. Sariput Nagar and Agripada are rehabilitated by providing alternative accommodation, Transportation and Shifting assistance as per the MUTP R & R Policy is provided.
- 5. Process of distribution and allotment of compensation and other R&R assistances
 - In a very transparent manner by using Computerised Lottery rehabilitation tenements were distributed.
- 6. When the compensation/assistance has been paid, and the utility of compensation amount and other R & R assistances
 - Since Private land acquisition is under progress, compensation is yet to be paid. The negotiation is going on.
 - Transportation allowance is paid to PAPs School going kids for the purpose of relocation.
- 7. Type of grievances, its reasons and measures taken to address these
 - Errors in Name of the head of the family of PAFs, Single unit having 2 ID Nos, incorrect Fathers name, Single premises having 2 claimants, Sale and Purchase of hutment etc. it has been carried on as per MUTP Policy.
- 8. Brief description of income generation activities undertaken by the PAFs
 - The NGO, deputed for undertaking such activities during port resettlement period has already started the motivational works through organizing focused groups discussions (FGDs), and discussions among the youth, entrepreneurs etc.
- 9. Major issues faced during RAP implementation and action taken to resolve it
 - RAP implementation is going on in smooth manner.
