

Project for Community Movement Program on Forest and Land Fire Prevention

Overview

Pressures from depletion and deterioration of forests due to forest fires, development of farmland, conversion of land use such as development of oil palm plantations, and illegal logging are increasing by the year, and fundamental measures have been identified as agendas not only for the country but for the global community as well.

This project aims to

- 1) establish a system for fire disaster measures,
- 2) develop community-based fire disaster prevention models / peatland management models,
- 3) support national-level policies in the six target priority provinces to decrease hotspots and burnt sites in one model district per province and thereby,
- 4) contribute to the wide-spread of this project's outputs to other districts in the target provinces and to other provinces as well.

Purpose

One model district, where hotspots and burnt area are decreased, is established in each of the target provinces.

Activities/Outputs

Institutional arrangement for forest and land fire control is operationalized in the six target districts.

Community-based forest and land fire prevention model is adopted at the district level.

Community-based sustainable peatland management model is developed at fire prone villages.

Policies and experiences on Community-based forest and land fire prevention are shared at the national level.
