The cartoon "Correct Handwashing" drawn by INOUE Kimidori, a cartoonist, has been translated into various languages and used as a tool for the JICA projects' health awareness activities around the world. The cartoon has been translated into 21 local languages as of 30 October 2020. Translation work is mainly carried out by JICA office staff and project members in each country, and Handwashing for health and life campaign secretariat and Office of Media & PR consolidate and publicize them.

Since Arabic is read from right to left, the cartoon in Arabic is arranged in inverted frames to allow for a smooth reading from right to left (this was also taken into account in advance during the creation of the cartoon). As you look at these cartoons, you're probably curious, "What language is this?"

Handwashing for health and life campaign in Laos

We're working with many partners to expand and root the Hand Washing Movement nationwide!

On October 15, Global Handwashing Day, a waterworks class incorporating handwashing was held at a school in central Laos with the cooperation of local waterworks authority. The waterworks class has been conducted by the Water Supply Authority in each province of Laos since 2014, which is the initial phase of MaWaSU 1, the predecessor of the ongoing technical cooperation "The Project for Improvement of Management Capacity of Water Supply Sector (MaWaSU 2)". The success factor was the accumulation of experience and knowledge in the Water Supply Authority through continuous cooperation and the fostering the relationship of trust with JICA, which enabled them to quickly adopt the handwashing activities and continue them on the Lao side itself. In addition, the Water Supply Authority was able to quickly prepare awareness-raising tools by sharing TV programs, posters and booklets for the dissemination of handwashing in Laos, which were prepared by UNICEF with the support of the Japanese government.

In starting this handwashing movement, we effectively made an impact by connecting JICA's assets already in the country with those of Japan. We will share these experiences with water authorities across Laos and will continue to work with experts in partnership with government agencies and development partners to ensure that the handwashing movement takes root across the country.

Note: As of October 15, 23 cases of COVID-19 were reported in Laos, with no increase since September 11. There have been no cases so far in Khammouane province, where the waterworks class was held.

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) celebrated Global Handwashing Day with Water Supply State Enterprise (WSSE) of Khammuan province on October 15. JICA collaborated with Khammuan's WSSE, one of the pilot state-run water supply networks under the Project MaWaSU2, to organise a waterworks education class at the Lao-Vietnam Friendship School in Thakhaek district. JICA is contributing to the prevention of infectious diseases, health promotion, and improvement of public health by incorporating hand-washing equipment and hygiene awareness activities into a wide range of its projects in developing countries through the "Handwashing for Health and Life" campaign. A standard waterworks education class, which is provided by WSSEs across the country every year, consists of basic understanding of water, how to purify water and supply it to households, and letting students know the importance water and water supply.
