Outline

The 3rd UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) was held in Sendai, Japan in March 2015, which concluded with "Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030". At the conference, the importance of the 'mainstreaming of DRR' was emphasized and included in the Sendai Framework. Mainstreaming DRR, which contributes to implementation of Priorities for Action 2 and 3 as well as Achievement of Global Target (e) of the Sendai Framework, consists of: a) prioritization of DRR in a country's policies; b) incorporation of DRR into plans and programs for development in all sectors or fields; and c) increased prior investment in DRR. Besides, mainstreaming DRR, with consideration of DRR in all sectors and adequate allocation of budget to implement necessary actions, has been a key factor of economic and social development of disaster-prone Japan. Mainstreaming DRR is essential for building resilient society and attaining sustainable development of disaster-prone countries. This program has an objective of promoting mainstreaming DRR in participants' countries by sharing experiences, lessons and good practices in Japan, as well as participating countries.
