The action plans will be presented and well-understood by all stakeholders in their home countries to facilitate the implementation of the plans.</p> <p><b>【Outcome】</b> 1. Participants will gain understandings on the needs of participatory community development. 2. Participants will obtain the different view points such as diversity, minority, inclusion and conflict resolution which are necessary for participatory community development. 3. Participants will gain know-hows on the way how to implement projects by using method of participatory community development. 4. Participants will be able to explain the linkage methodology among wide variety of stake-holders. 5. Participants will be able to formulate an Action Plan toward participatory community development.</p>	<p><b>【Target Organization】</b> 1. Have at least 2 years experience with the institution. 2. Leaders of NGOs are favorable, but, not required. 3. Strong commitment in continuous involvement in participatory community dev. 4. <p><b>【Core Phase in Japan】</b> 1. Analysis and presentation of the case studies on the participatory community development managed by the participants. 2. To learn about participatory community development from the cases of Japanese institutions which experienced various conflicts and found the ways to reconcile the situation. 3. To visit organizations which work with local communities in order to learn "roles of outsiders in participatory community development" and "facilitation skills" to promote residents` own development. 4. To bring "Workshops" and "Field Works" into the training sessions proactively and analyze diversity and inclusiveness issues in participatory community development. 5. Discussions and analysis on the issues of diversified stake-holders with regard to participatory community development. 6. Formulation, presentation and discussion of Action Plans which are based on the outputs of the training program.</p> <p><b>【Finalization Phase in Home Country】</b> 1.
