COMPLETION CEREMONY - FLUE GAS DESULPHURIZATION CONSTRUCTION PROJECT FOR THERMAL POWER PLANT NIKOLA TESLA

On April 25, the flue gas desulphurization plant on four power generation units in the Nikola Tesla A, Thermal power plant in Obrenovac, officially started operating. This is the first Japanese Yen loan project in Serbia, and it was successfully completed after twelve years from loan agreement signing.

Completion ceremony, which was hosted by Elektroprivreda Srbije (EPS), gathered the Minister of Mining and Energy, and the Minister of Environmental Protection from Serbia, as well as Parliamentary Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs from Japan, Ambassador of Japan, representatives of JICA Balkan Office and Japanese companies.

Utilizing Japanese technology and stringent environmental standards this project will contribute to significant reduction in sulfur dioxide emissions as well as dust emissions and comply with European standards and national regulations.

“In this plant, Japanese technology of flue gas desulfurization by wet limestone process has been introduced. Gypsum is obtained as a by-product

during the technological process, which can be sold and used in the construction industry. The project was realized despite the impact of Covid 19 and the war in Ukraine, and thanks to the incredible support we constantly had from the lender JICA. Without this help, it would be very difficult to finish this important project.

The friendship between the two countries of Japan and Serbia can be seen by a board with an inscription on the building: “ODA loan from the people of Japan as a sign of friendship and cooperation between Japan and Serbia.” The motto of friendship between the peoples of Japan and Serbia was felt during the ceremony held on April 25. After a little more than four years of construction, the operational acceptance certificate was issued on March 28. The plant is currently in normal operating mode. We will continue to take care of this facility in the best way possible in the following period.”

COUNTRY FOCUS TRAINING ON CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT FOR POWER GRID STABILIZATION TOWARDS MASS INTRODUCTION OF RENEWABLE ENERGY FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF EPS

Eleven employees of the Ministry of Mining and Energy, JSC Elektroprivreda Srbije and JSC Elektromreza Srbije stayed in Japan from mid-January to the beginning of February, where professional training on Capacity Development for Power Grid Stabilization towards

Mass Introduction of Renewable Energy' was organized by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

The training in Kitakyushu was designed and organized as an exchange of experiences between employees in the Japanese

and Serbian energy sectors, with the aim of adopting the best practices for the integration of renewable sources into the power system.

The participants of the training had the opportunity to learn about the development of the power sector in Japan and its specific characteristics, as well as with the entire process of integration of renewable energy sources in Japan. This included aspects from connection procedures and real-time system balancing to overcoming challenges arising during the long-term increase in the installed power of variable sources. Visits were also organized to significant energy installations on the island of Kyushu, such as the Omarugawa pumped storage hydro power plant, the Buzen and Omuta battery installations, and the main dispatch centre on the island.

"This visit to Japan represented a blend of business and cultural experience, with a far-reaching impact on the professional and personal development of all training participants, who hope to continue cooperation with Japanese colleagues and look forward to visiting this beautiful country again" commented one of the participants from EPS.

MONTENEGRO

TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROJECT ON CAPACITY BUILDING FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION (DRR) THROUGH NATIONAL FOREST FIRE INFORMATION SYSTEM (NFFIS) AND ECO-DRR

JICA in cooperation with the Ministry of Interior in Montenegro, has been implementing the Project on Capacity Building for Disaster

Risk Reduction through National Forest Fire Information System (NFFIS) and Eco-DRR since 2021.

One of the Eco-DRR activities is to support coast forest area which is deforested and degraded. To protect residence and agricultural area from sea wind and sand, and to prevent soil erosion, approximately 4000 seedlings have been planned on the coastal side in Ulcinj municipality.

JICA Balkan Office representatives together with the Japanese consultants and municipal representatives visited Ulcinj area in May this year.

The project acknowledges the importance of environmental education activities in schools; hence, the activities are planned to continue during its implementation in 2024. In order to obtain a legal framework for Eco-DRR activities and Coastal Forest management plan, the activities and the plan will be incorporated into spatial plan of Ulcinj municipality.

SERBIA

COMPLETION OF PROJECT FOR CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT OF SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT IN THE REPUBLIC OF SERBIA

Since its beginning, the project has aimed to promote a regional waste management system throughout Serbia by establishing Efficient and sustainable Municipal Solid Waste Management (MSWM) in Sid municipality as a model for small and medium-sized municipalities and sharing its experience as a model for improving waste management in these municipalities.

Furthermore, by contributing to the achievement of environmental standards set by the European Union (EU) and improving the recycling rate, the project will help Serbia achieve its national goal of EU membership.

Specifically, the project aims to: (1) Enhance capacity for analyzing current issues and challenges of MSWM in Sid municipality in line with guidance and standards of regional waste management system; (2) Improve capacity for waste collection and transportation with source separation; (3) Establish methodologies for minimizing waste generation and promotion of 3Rs; (4) Enhance capacity for waste minimization and source separation with 3R principles among various stakeholders such as residents and business entities; (5) Enhance financial, organizational and institutional capacities

regarding MSWM; (6) Summarize experience of establishing sustainable MSWM in Sid municipality as “Sid Model” and shared with small and medium-sized municipalities.

Throughout the project period, the Japanese Expert team and counterpart organizations (Ministry of Environmental Protection, Sid

Municipality, PUC Standard Sid) faced a series of challenges that were overcome with sincere collaboration and cooperation. Finally, the project team archived all project outputs and the project purpose. In the future, the Sid model is expected to be disseminated throughout the country and improve MSWM in Serbia.

REGIONAL SEMINAR ON PROJECT FOR CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT FOR AIR POLLUTION CONTROL PHASE 2

The seminar was held on February 28 and 29, and attended by representatives of central and local institutions, representatives from academia, economic operators, representatives from counterpart institutions, guests from North Macedonia and Albania, Japanese experts implementing the project, JICA HQ (Tokyo), and JICA Balkan Office.

The aim of the workshop was to present the activities carried out by the Project for Capacity Development for Air Pollution Control Phase 2. In the seminar, the activities and achievements of the project related to the study of emission reduction measures for large combustion plants, air quality monitoring activities related to air quality data management, emission inventory activities and modeling to estimate the contribution from emission sources, the study of emission control measures for these emission sources as well as the support of policy proposals were presented.

The purpose of the Project is to develop capacities for air quality management based on the technical evidence and will be implemented until June 2026.

NAŠA KUĆA: COOPERATION WITH JTI COMPANY FROM JAPAN

The Japan Tobacco International (JTI) company's support for the NAŠA KUĆA association began in 2017 through financing the development of the hydroponic production of herbs and micro herbs. Through this project the number of beneficiaries increased from 10 persons, who were working on the production of paper bags and packaging, to 40 in 2024. The company JTI, together with JICA, is the main ally of NAŠA KUĆA in the creation of a program for job training and employment of people with developmental disabilities.

From 2020, a new cycle of JICA support began with the sponsorship of JTI, on the program of manual paper production using Japanese technology.

This JTI support has enabled NAŠA KUĆA to develop into a successful social enterprise that has the capacity to transfer knowledge and experience to other organizations that provide support to people with disabilities. From 2023, we jointly started a new phase of forming a network of Social Enterprises throughout Serbia.

In the first phase of the formation of the network, 7 organizations across Serbia have been equipped, trained and empowered. In the second phase, that number will increase to 10, and the total number of people employed in the network will be around 200.

ALUMNI SERBIA WORKSHOP: RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITY AS A PROSUMER OF ELECTRICITY

On February 1, a workshop under the title “Residential community as a prosumer of electricity” was held at the Science and Technology Park in city of Niš (Motorola Hall).

The participants of the workshop were professional managers of residential buildings, students of the Faculty of Electronics in Niš, students of the Faculty of Civil Engineering and Architecture in Niš, as well as students and teachers at the High school of electrical engineering “Nikola Tesla” in Niš. The total number of participants in the workshop was 65.

The goal of the workshop was to promote the use of renewable energy sources, especially solar energy, for transformation into electricity on the roofs of residential buildings, considering that the roofs of residential buildings represent a great potential for the use of solar energy, and an opportunity to achieve the goals of sustainable development in the period of energy transition.

The lecturers at the workshop were a professor of Faculty of Mechanical Engineering in Niš, a professor of the faculty of Law, Nis and a mechanical engineer who spoke about his experiences in the construction of a photovoltaic solar power plant in the Magdon residential community in Niš.

All participants received a brochure with brief instruction how to the residential community could become a “Prosumer” of electricity.
