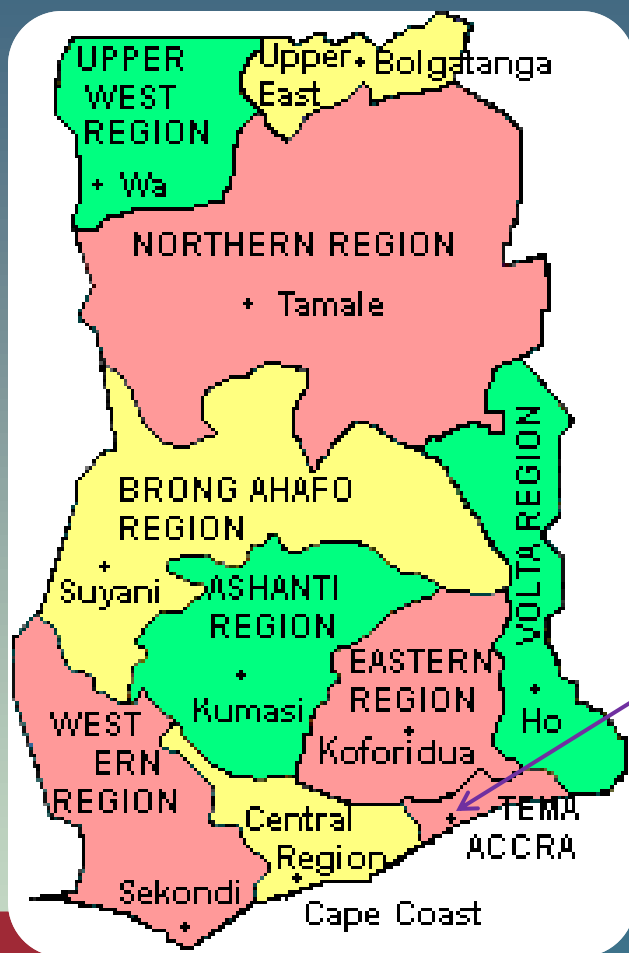
Implementing Organization: National AIDS/STIs Control Programme and Greater Accra Regional Health Directorate, Ghana Health Service

Activity



Mother to child transmission of HIV is main way by which children under five years in Ghana acquire the virus. This makes the Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV (PMTCT) programme a very important intervention in Ghana.

In view of this, JICA has commenced the project for Strengthening Operational Capacity for Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV.

The project is expect to strengthen PMTCT service delivery by enhancing the capacity of PMTCT counsellors, HIV&AIDS Coordinators, supervisors, and trainers at the regional, metro/district and sub-metro levels through the development of a PMTCT practical handbook.

The use of the handbook will guide practice of trained health personnel and help standardize operational procedure of PMTCT services and data management at the facility level.

Ghana is one of the 22 countries with the highest estimated numbers of pregnant women living with HIV. The country is targeting virtual elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV (eMTCT) by 2015. Through learning from each other's experiences with the Ghanaian counterparts while working hand-in-hand, the project attempts to contribute to the attainment of the eMTCT target by strengthening PMTCT service delivery in the Greater Accra Region, one of the most populated regions in the country.
