Delegates at the FECCEBEJA XII, the 12th Regional Conference of JICA Alumni Associations for Central America and the Caribbean, which was held in San Salvador from February 27 to March 1, 2020, took a serious look at some of the challenges facing the various associations regionally. Chief among the challenges are membership engagement and membership retention. As a body, FECCEBEJA will continue to provide the framework where member associations can share transferrable ideas within the region.

Each member association has a duty to map and be aware of the needs of its membership. Therefore new approaches to membership engagement and retention must be explored immediately. The JICA Alumni Association in Jamaica, JAAJ, as a member of FECCEBEJA agrees with this position, and has recommitted to lending its support towards the realization of this goal.
