The Manufacturing sector is empirically tested as the key driving force of economic development throughout the world. In this study, "manufacturing as a growth engine" hypothesis is reconsidered in a panel of 127 developed and developing countries from 1995 to 2019. A falling trend in GDP per capita growth responsiveness of manufacturing sector share of GDP with rising economic growth is revealed from the quantile regression analysis. This was substantiated by the System GMM approach employed on the same data including an interaction term between manufacturing sector share and GDP per capita. It is also conjectured from the fixed effects estimation that corruption, political instability and terrorism tend to incapacitate the growth engine characteristic of the manufacturing sector.
