

## Three Priority Areas

### 1. Economic Growth

**A**gricultural development has been a priority area of JICA's cooperation to the government of Tanzania in the last 50 years. JICA's cooperation, especially on rice production through irrigation development, started from Kilimanjaro Region and has now extended to the whole country including Zanzibar.

In the **industrial development** sector, JICA provides technical assistance to small and medium- sized enterprises (SMEs) for quality management and productivity.



### 2. Infrastructure Development

**J**ICA has been one of the most active partners in the development of infrastructure, especially in the **transport** and **electricity** sub- sectors. This support has mainly been directed to urban areas including where demand is relatively higher. Such support includes construction and rehabilitation of facilities using grant aid and ODA loans and improvement of maintenance and management system using technical cooperation.

In the **water** sector, JICA assists in improving people's access to safe and clean water in rural areas, and in promoting sustainable and effective use of limited water resources.



### 3. Improvement of Public Service


**J**ICA has been supporting the efforts of the government of Tanzania in **local government reform** and in strengthening the **administrative and financial management capacity of the public sector**, in order to achieve effective, efficient, fair and equal provision of public services based on the needs of citizens.

JICA has actively been involved in the strengthening of national and regional health administration managements in order to improve service delivery to the people. Moreover JICA also assists school education and vocational training through the dispatch of volunteers.

## Inclusive and Dynamic Development

The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) is an independent governmental agency that coordinates Official Development Assistance (ODA) of the government of Japan. JICA is the world's largest bilateral aid agency, works in over 150 countries and regions and has some 100 overseas offices, 34 of which are in Africa including Tanzania.

In Tanzania, Japanese cooperation started in 1962. JICA is working with the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania for the development and happiness of its people.

## Jica 'S On-Going Activities In Tanzania (typical examples as of 2013)

### Shinyanga

JICA finances the project for strengthening reproductive health services, which is jointly implemented by 2 NGOs, JOICFP (Japan) and UMATI (Tanzania). Community-based service providers who are selected from villages are trained.

### Arusha

Through ODA loan, JICA provides financial support for the upgrading of Arusha-Namanga-Athi River Road which contributes in the facilitation of the transport network between Tanzania and Kenya and beyond.

### Kilimanjaro

Japan's ODA built irrigation scheme at Lower Moshi in the 1970's. Since then, Japanese agriculture experts have supported Agriculture Training Centres in Kilimanjaro and other areas to implement farmers' training Programs. As a result of these programs farmers have increased their harvests in many areas now.

### Zanzibar

JICA supports the improvement of water facilities in the urban area of Zanzibar. For sustainability of such facilities, JICA assists Zanzibar Water Authority to improve its financial situation by enhancing its capacity of water utility and financial management.

### Dar es Salaam

JICA supports human resource development in TANESCO, aiming at strengthening of transmission and distribution network through training programs for engineers and technicians. About 2100 employees will be trained on proper maintenance of TANESCO facilities.

### Morogoro/Coast/Dodoma

JICA provides technical assistance to establish a good model for Opportunities & Obstacles to Development (O&OD) which is a participatory process for community development as outlined in the Local Government Reform Program.

### Dodoma/Iringa

Rural Road Maintenance System Development Project is aiming at capacity development of district engineers on planning, procurement, implementation and evaluation of rural road maintenance / development.
