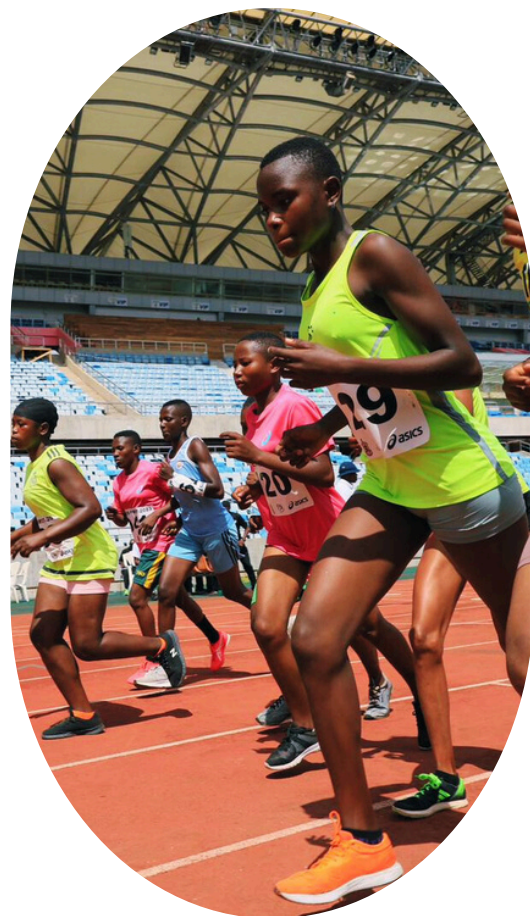

“Ladies First” is a women’s athletics event, which was initiated and inspired by the vision of Mr. Juma Ikangaa, a former Tanzanian athlete. The primary objective was to close the gap in women’s participation in sports by providing young women with opportunities to compete at a high level. Over the years, the event has evolved in scope and significance, becoming a key platform for promoting gender equality, women’s empowerment and promoting sports and dissemination of physical education in Tanzania. Each edition of the event has been instrumental in addressing the underrepresentation of women in sports, particularly in leadership positions and competitive athletics.

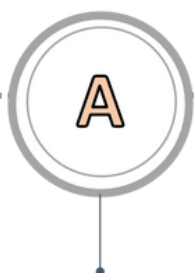

Leadership



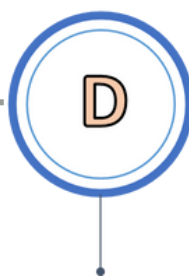
To Provide opportunities for women athletes to become role models and demonstrate **leadership** in sports.

History of Japan's ODA & TICAD

1962

First Tanzanian government officials participated in technical training in Japan.

1965

Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers is founded.
First JICA experts were dispatched to Tanzania.

1974

JICA is founded.

1974

JICA Tanzania Office was opened.

1954

Japan joins the Colombo Plan and starts providing technical cooperation.

1958

Japan starts ODA loans.

1967

Members of the **JOCV** started to be dispatched to Tanzania

1968

Grant aid (food aid) starts.

1989

Japan becomes the top donor surpassing the United States.

TICAD I (Japan) / 1993

Adopted the Tokyo Declaration on African Development, which pledged to draw on Asia's experience in African development.

TICAD II (Japan) / 1998

Advocated "ownership" by African countries and the importance of "partnership" with development partners.

TICAD III (Japan) / 2003

Agreed to support the New Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD), launched by the African Union in 2001.

TICAD IV (Japan) / 2008

Adopted the "Yokohama Declaration" and "Yokohama Action Plan," which indicate efforts such as doubling ODA to Africa.

TICAD V (Japan) / 2013

Pledged up to ¥3.2 trillion in public-private initiatives in Africa over five years.

TICAD VI (Kenya) / 2016

Expressed the commitment to "investing in the future" by developing infrastructure, promoting health systems and so on.

TICAD 7 (Japan) / 2019

Improving the business environment through innovation, deepening sustainable and resilient societies, and strengthening peace and stability are the three pillars of African cooperation.

TICAD 8 (Tunisia) / 2022

Expressed its commitment to a strong Africa through a "uniquely Japanese approach that focuses on people."
