victims.

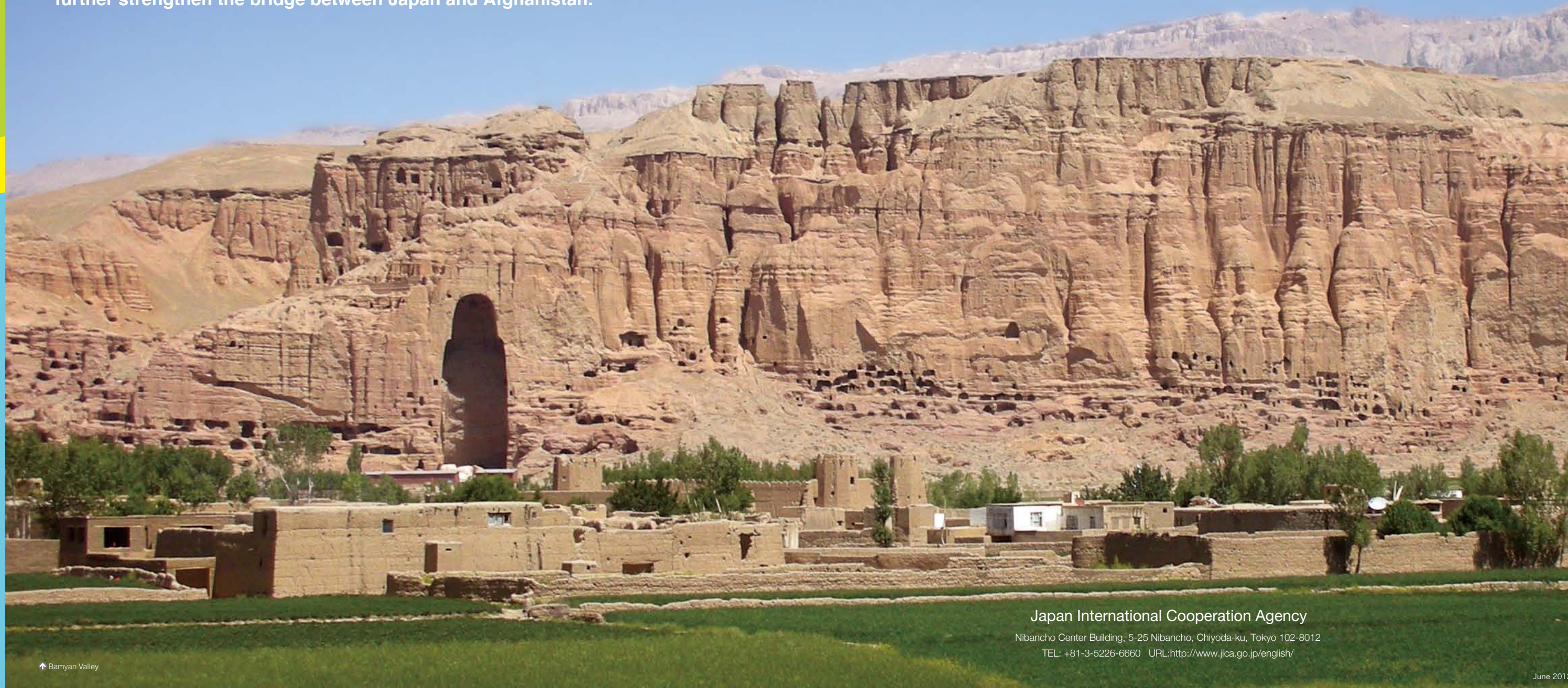
Linked by friendship, the international community aims to help prevent
