History

- April 23, 1999** The Japan Bank for International Cooperation Law promulgated.
- September 16, 1999** Cabinet order related to the execution of the Japan Bank for International Cooperation Law promulgated.
- September 30, 1999** Ministerial Ordinance related to the execution of the Japan Bank for International Cooperation Law published on official register.
- October 1, 1999** Japan Bank for International Cooperation established.
- December 1, 1999** Medium-Term Strategy for Overseas Economic Cooperation Operations launched.

Reference Dates

The Export-Import Bank of Japan

- December 15, 1950 "Japan Export Bank Law" promulgated and enforced.
- February 1, 1951 The Export Bank of Japan started operations.
- April 1, 1952 Added import loans and guarantee facilities.
Changed name to "The Export-Import Bank of Japan."
- August 1, 1953 Added overseas investment loan facility.
- May 20, 1957 Enhanced overseas investment loan facility.
- October 31, 1958 Started to manage Southeast Asia Development Cooperation Fund.
- December 27, 1960 Southeast Asia Development Cooperation Fund transferred to the Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund, Japan.
- April 15, 1963 Opened Osaka Office.
- April 1, 1964 Added refinance operation and guarantee facility to cover for ODA loans.
- April 1, 1970 Added petroleum and natural gas to eligible commodity items for import loans.
- September 22, 1972 Started the provision of foreign currency-denominated loans.
- November 15, 1972 Enhanced import loan and overseas investment loan facilities.
Launched untied loan facility.
- June 2, 1976 Broadened the range of eligible cofinancing partners and the limit of bond issuance and borrowings.
- July 1, 1977 Opened Osaka Branch.
- December 20, 1977 Launched emergency foreign currency-denominated import loan scheme.
Permitted to conduct foreign exchange operations.
- January 19, 1983 Issued first foreign currency-denominated bonds.
- February 1, 1983 Broadened the range of eligible cofinancing partners.
- November 1, 1983 Launched import loan facility for manufactured goods.
- June 7, 1985 Expanded overseas investment loan and guarantee facility.
- June 28, 1989 Introduced equity participation and enhanced untied loan and guarantee facilities.
- March 31, 1992 Expanded eligible commodities for import loans, enhanced overseas investment loan facility, launched bridge loan facility for foreign governments and issued yen-denominated Euro bonds
- April 10, 1992 Broadened the range of eligible cofinancing partners.
- April 9, 1999 Broadened the range of eligible cofinancing partners.

The Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund, Japan

- December 27, 1960 "The Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund, Japan Law" promulgated.
- March 16, 1961 The Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund, Japan (OECF) was established, and took over Southeast Asia Development Cooperation Fund from the Export-Import Bank of Japan
- March 31, 1961 OECF started operation (at first, OECF only implemented private-sector investment finance for Japanese private companies; direct ODA loans to developing countries began in 1966).
- June 15, 1965 Added provisions to allow OECF to borrow funds, issue bonds, and accept grants from the government. A borrowing limit based on a 1:1 principle (The total present value of the outstanding amount of principals for borrowings and bonds can not exceed the total amount of capital and reserves). was set for the total amount of debt.
- May 30, 1968 Added commodity loan facility.
- November 15, 1972 Started direct ODA loans on an untied basis.
- May 9, 1979 1:1 principle was revised, to raise the limit for borrowings and bond issuance to three times total capital plus reserves. Government guarantee for debt pertaining to long-term borrowings and bond issuance by OECF was introduced.
- March 21, 1980 Issued first government-guaranteed OECF bond.
- 1987 Started Special Assistance for Project Sustainability (SAPS).
- 1988 Started Special Assistance for Project Formulation (SAPROF).
- October 1, 1990 Established Research Institute of Development Assistance.
- 1992 Started Special Assistance for Project Implementation (SAPI).
- 1996 Started Special Assistance for Development Policy and Projects (SADEP).
- December 16, 1998 Started Special Yen (ODA) Loan facility.

October 1, 1999 Japan Bank for International Cooperation established.
