Under the New Growth Strategy, JICA is aiming to leverage Japan's expertise and technologies as effective tools for resolving the development issues of developing countries and achieve mutual prosperity for Japan and

these countries. As a new initiative, JICA is carrying out Preparatory Surveys for Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Infrastructure projects as well as Preparatory Surveys for Base of the Pyramid (BOP) Business Promotion.

Drawing on Lessons Learned from the Great Hanshin Earthquake and Japan's Know-How

In the Wake of the Haiti and Chile Earthquakes, JICA Provides Reconstruction and Disaster Risk Management Cooperation

The earthquakes which hit Haiti in January 2010 and Chile in February 2010 devastated both countries. For Haiti, JICA provided swift and seamless cooperation, including the Urgent Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Support Project based on the findings of the Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA), which was conducted with the United Nations, the Inter-American Development Bank and other organizations. JICA also provided trainings in Japan on the reconstruction process. For Chile, JICA implemented a Technical Cooperation project through which JICA experts shared

Japan's experience and knowledge related to Japan's tsunami observation system and technology, among other technologies. Moving forward, JICA will carry out activities, such as joint research with Chile on tsunami disaster countermeasures* and other measures for disaster risk management.

South Sudan Overcomes Long Fought Conflict and Heads Towards Independence

Assistance for Achieving Peace in the Two Sudans

Six years after the 2005 Comprehensive Peace Agreement was reached, a referendum took place in southern Sudan in January 2011, and people of South Sudan chose independence from the North. In 2006, JICA opened offices in both southern and northern Sudan and has provided assistance for the consolidation of peace and the prevention of conflict recurrence. In the South, JICA's assistance has included assistance for war-affected people through vocational training and livelihood improvement in communities; assistance to meet basic

needs, including health, science and math education, and water supply improvements; and assistance for infrastructure reconstruction, including the rehabilitation of roads and river ports. JICA will continue to provide assistance to South and North Sudan to enable people still suffering from conflict to enjoy the "peace dividend" as much as possible.

JICA Carries Out Emergency Relief Operations Overseas and in Japan

Teams Dispatched for Flood Disaster in Pakistan, Great East Japan Earthquake, etc.

In fiscal 2010, long rainfalls and flooding wreaked much havoc, beginning with the flood damage in Pakistan which affected more than 20 million people. JICA's assistance included the dispatch of medical teams and provision of supplies to the country. In the wake of the Great East Japan Earthquake in March 2011, JICA provided logistical support for the United Nations Disaster Assessment and Coordination (UNDAC) team and the Israeli medical team in Japan.

To Increase Development Effectiveness, JICA Strengthens Partnerships with Emerging Countries

In October, a joint seminar on environmental and social considerations was held among JICA and the development agencies of the Republic of Korea. China and Thailand. Furthermore, in December, JICA held its first regular consultation with the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA). In order to maximize development outcomes, JICA will continue to build strong partnerships and hold strategic dialogues with these organizations.
